to conduct Kathak workshop in Dhaka

Legendary Kathak artiste and dance guru Pandit Birj Maharaj and his foremost disciple Shaswati Sen will conduct a five-day Kathak workshop in Dhaka. Bangladeshi dance troupe Nrityanchal, in associatio with Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy (BSA), is arrang ing the workshop, from June 21 to 25 at BSA. A press conference in this regard will be held at BSA on June 20 at 5 pm. Pandit Birju Maharaj will address the confer-

Around 200 Kathak artistes from across the country will take part in the workshop. Upon conclusion of the workshop, participating artistes will present a Kathak piece, directed by Pandit Birju Maharaj, at the National Theatre Hall of BSA on June 25 at 7 pm. Pandit Birju Maharaj and Shaswati Sen will also perform in the second half of the programme.

Kathak is a well-known classical dance genre of the

Indian subcontinent. The dance form maintains the guru-shishya parampara [master-disciple tradition]. Kathak has gained much popularity in postindependence Bangladesh.

Today there are a fairly large number of Kathak artistes in Bangladesh. Nrityanchal director duo Shibli Mohammad, the first Bangladeshi student of Pandit Birju Maharaj, and Shamim Ara Nipa have taken Kathak to new heights in Bangladesh.

Many Bangladeshi artistes, either on scholarships or at an individual level, have trained in Kathak under Pandit Birju Maharaj and Shaswati Sen at Kathak Kendra, Delhi, India. They are now training a new generation of Bangladeshi artistes in Kathak.

The presence of Pandit Birju Maharaj in Dhaka, his workshop, and giving performance are rare landmarks not just for Bangladeshi dancers but also cultural


