The thespian turned director recently spoke to The Daily Star.

Are you currently busy with shooting? Zahid Hasan: Yes, I'm shooting in Sirajganj. This is my hometown; I was born and brought up here. I'm directing a new serial called "Toto Company", written by Ashraful Chanchal.

What is the story about? Zahid Hasan: It's about life in a small town -- the reason why I chose my own district town to shoot the drama. I hope the audience will enjoy the serial, as well as receive its message.

Are you acting in the serial? Zahid Hasan: Yes. I play the role of a journalist.

Is it difficult to direct and act at the same time? Zahid Hasan: I am known as an actor. I'm more com fortable when I'm acting. 


