"I am sincerely sorry that my comments have caused controversy and protests among gay groups."

Usha end 13-year wait

Usha Krira Chakra ended a 13-year Club Cup Hockey cup title drought in style when they

staged a spectacular come-frombehind 3-2 win over Abahani in the Walton Club Cup Hockey final at the Maulana Bhasani Hockey Stadium vesterday.

The old town outfit who last won the traditional season's curtainraising tournament in 1999 came tantalisingly close to winning the trophy two year's back but were robbed in a 'disputed final' against Mohammedan.

This time however it was a fair and highly entertaining game tension in the middle never turned ugly which has often been the case in domestic hockey.

Pakistani Alim Billal and Mohammad Mudassar put Ahahani ahead before Usha's Pakistani trio of Mohammad Imran, Selim Khalid and Ehsan Ulllah Khan punched back for glory in a final witnessed by sparse yet vocal fans.

After squandering the first penalty corner, Abahani went ahead by converting the second penalty corner in the 18th minute with Alim Billal hitting a fierce low drive.

But they struggled to keep the momentum and Usha slowly but steadily started to impose their authority.

Usha came close twice in the latter part of the first half but Abahani goalkeeper Zahid Hossain, hero of their win over Mohammedan, brilliantly foiled a fiercely driven penalty corner from Ehasan Ullah while Pakistani Selim sent the ball wide despite beating goalkeeper Zahid.

After the resumption, Usha dominated the game with better movements from midfielders Shahidullah Titu, Mosharraf Hossain Kuti, Pakistani Shahbaz Ali and Sarwar

Hossain. But Abahani doubled the lead from a counter-attack three minutes into the second half.

Availing a clearance from defence, Niloy raced down the right flank to enter the box before cutting it back for the unmarked Modassar who tapped the ball in from a handshaking distance. Abahani appeared to run out of

gas with the progress of the match, allowing Usha to launch waves of attacks down the left flank and they struck two goals within three minutes to level the margin.



Portugal beat Denmark 3-2 in a thrilling Euro 2012 Group B clash here on Wednesday to keep alive their hopes of reaching the quarterfinals.

A stunning goal by substitute Silvestre Varela three minutes from time saw the 2004 finalists take the points after they had let slip a 2-0 lead as Danish striker Nicklas Bendtner drew the Danes level with two headers.

Goals from Pepe -- with a superb header -- and Helder Postiga, with his 20th goal for his country, had given the Portuguese a perfect start.

However, a series of terrible misses by their star player Cristiano Ronaldo had threatened to prove very costly until Varela stepped up to save them just three minutes after coming on.

The win puts Portugal level on

points with Denmark, who beat the Dutch in their opening game, while Germany top the table and take on Holland later on Wednesday.

The Danes had the first chance in the fifth minute as the ball deflected to highly-rated youngster Christian Eriksen inside the area but Pepe did well to block his goalbound shot.

The Portuguese managed to put very little together in the opening 20 minutes save once when Ronaldo drifted in from the wing into the centre and played the ball to Raul Meireles.

Meireles found the Real Madrid star -- just five goals in 15 tournament matches -- in space but he produced a woeful shot and tried to blame the pitch as he looked ruefully down at it afterwards.

However, he was not found wanting when he delivered his corner in the

24th minute as Pepe came steaming in to head home, the ball flying in over Danish midfielder William Kvist's head at the near post.

Ronaldo appeared to take heart out of that and he was unfortunate to see an on-target freekick take a deflection off a Danish defender in the 32nd minute.

But he did not have to wait long for his side to double their lead.

His former Manchester United teammate Nani was the creator, passing the ball into the box where Postiga got a yard on his marker Simon Kjaer and put the ball away with a sharp finish.

The Danes, though, got themselves back in the match four minutes before half-time as a smart header across the goal from Michael Krohn-Dehli found Bendtner unmarked and he made no mistake with a close range header to
