# Brothers finally back with a win

Brothers Union returned to winning ways after four straight defeats in the Grameenphone Bangladesh Premier Football League with a single-goal win over Farashganj SC at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

Nigerian forward Joshua Olalekin separated both the sides striking his fifth goal in the league on 15 minutes and took Brothers Union to seventh place from ninth with 18 points from 17 matches. Farashganj SC on the other hand, slipped to eighth place from the seventh having 17 points from same number of outings.

Brothers, who have been struggling in the second leg conceding four straight defeats, yesterday looked desperate to end the losing

streak and played better against Farashganj SC, who have momentum after beating title contenders Muktiyoddha Sangsad and holders Sheikh Jamal Dhanmondi Club before holding Mohammedan.

Brothers went ahead capitalizing on the first opportunity they created on 15 minutes as Joshua shot home inside the box after a Saikat push came his way. Farashganj found the equalizer on the half-hour mark but it was ruled out due to off-side.

Farashganj SC without their regular striker Siyo Zunapio tried hard but they could hardly break the backline of Brothers though they yielded two good chances in the second half.

Substitute Akbar Hossain Ridon shot wide inside the danger zone eight minute into the second half while Teajieu Metenou Alban headed wide in the 67th minute.

# Viv foresees Eng reign

West Indies legend Sir Vivian Richards said Tuesday he expects Andrew Strauss's England to dominate Test cricket over the next few years.

England took over the top of the Test rankings for the first time last summer, displacing India with a 4-0 series whitewash after an Ashes series win in Australia.

And Richards, 60, who played a starring role in the all-conquering Windies team that did not lose a Test series between 1980 and 1995, feels Strauss's men can enjoy a long stay at the top.

"England are well led by Andrew Strauss and this is a team that has the potential to create a legacy," he told BBC Sport.

"They have done their homework and found a solid wicket-taking bowling unit

which is of vital importance at this level."

Richards, who scored 8,540 runs in 121 Tests, warned though that England's iconic status hinged on their ability to win away.

England were beaten 3-0 by Pakistan in the United Arab Emirates earlier this year and, after drawing 1-1 in Sri Lanka, face a tough trip to India at the end of the year.

"It is up to the individuals, but in order to become legendary and great you must be able to win in all conditions," he said.

"It is not just getting it done at home, it is going to places like India and Pakistan and getting a result.

"You don't necessarily have to win, drawing a series can be a good result. It's like football where away from home, a point is just as vital.

"Not losing, scrapping, this is what great teams do and England have a unit assembled to accomplish that."

"Roberto's quality was clear for all to see when he galvanised the squad last season and helped the club make history, and the owner and board are very pleased he will be continuing his good work," said Chelsea chief executive Ron Gourlay.

## Third ODI abandoned

The third one-day international between Sri Lanka and Pakistan was abandoned due to rain in Colombo on Wednesday.

Pakistan were 12-2 off 6.2 overs after electing to bat when play was called off, with Asad Shafiq unbeaten on five and skipper Misbahul Haq yet to open his account.

Pacemen Lasith Malinga and Nuwan Kulasekara each bagged one wicket for Sri Lanka.

The five-match series is currently tied 1-1, with Pakistan winning the opening one-day by six wickets and Sri Lanka winning the second game by 76 runs in Pallekele.

The fourth one-day will be played in Colombo on Saturday.

## Rafa's €300k stolen watch recovered

Paris police have recovered a 300,000-euro watch stolen from Rafael Nadal at the hotel where he stayed during the French Open and arrested a hotel employee, a police source said Wednesday.

The source said police tracked down the presumed thief, a hotel barman, on Tuesday after tracing his hotel access badge, which was used to access the room in which Nadal stayed with his parents during the championship.

He confessed to having entered Nadal's room and taken the luxury watch, and brought police to the spot where he had hidden it along a railway track near his home in the Essonne area south of Paris, the source said.

French media reported that luxury watchmaker Richard Mille had lent Nadal the watch for the French Open, which the Spanish tennis sensation won for a record seventh time Monday, beating Serbia's Novak Djokovic.

# SA unchanged for Eng

South Africa have kept faith with a winning formula by naming an unchanged squad for the three-Test series in England starting next month, Cricket South Africa (CSA) announced on Wednesday.

The 15-man squad is identical to the touring side that beat New Zealand 1-0 in a three-Test series in March.

The Proteas are currently ranked number two in the world behind England and convenor of selectors Andrew Hudson believes consistency and depth of squad have been the key ingredients to the team's success.

"The players fully deserve a vote of confidence after the outstanding manner in which they outplayed New Zealand away from home," Hudson said in a statement.

"Consistency has also been one of the key pillars of our selection policy and this is also contributing to our success on the field. We are now building up excellent depth in both

the batting and bowling departments."

Opening batsman Graeme Smith will again captain the side after recovering from ankle surgery.

"Graeme has been outstanding both as our leading run scorer and as captain during our last two Test tours of England and I have every confidence he will continue that form," Hudson added.

The South Africa squad boasts a formidable pace attack spearheaded by the world's top-ranked Test bowler Dale Steyn, backed up by Vernon Philander, who has taken 51 wickets in just seven Tests, and Morne Morkel.

The Test series begins at the Oval on July 19 before moving to Headingley in Leeds on August 2. The series concludes with the final Test at Lord's starting on August 16.

# IPL not ICC's cup of tea

The International Cricket Council (ICC) will not consider creating an official window for the Indian Premier League (IPL) in its Future Tours Programme, according to the outgoing ICC chief executive Haroon Lorgat.

The issue of clashing schedules has been apparent since the IPL began in 2008 and refuses to disappear, with this year's tournament forcing West Indies players to choose between the IPL and their home Test series against Australia.

Next year will be no different as New Zealand's cricketers, who can earn significantly more as an IPL player than they do via their national contracts, are due to visit England for a Test tour during the second half of the IPL. England's cricketers regularly have national duties that prevent them from playing a full IPL tournament.

But despite the risk of players choosing the IPL over representing their countries, the ICC remains opposed to the idea of incorporating the two-month tournament into the Future Tours Programme. Lorgat, whose tenure in charge of the ICC finishes at the end of June, said creating a window for the IPL would set a dangerous precedent.

"The consequence of that [an IPL window] is what do we do with the Big Bash League?" Lorgat said. "What do we do with other premier leagues -- Sri Lanka is launching one, Bangladesh has one. I know people might say the IPL is the premier league, but once you provide a window for one particular member, you have to be conscious of the fact you may well have to do it for other members. Hence why we have not been supportive of a window specifically for any one of those domestic leagues."

Although an official IPL window is not on the agenda of cricket's administrators, each country's board would bear the tournament in mind when scheduling bilateral tours. That is certainly the case for New Zealand, whose board and players' association have an agreement to avoid scheduling international series that would clash with the IPL.

But such a conflict was inescapable next year, with New Zealand due to visit England for a Test tour in a year that also features an Ashes series in England. As a result, the New Zealand players could miss the warm-up matches ahead of the Test series. James Sutherland, the Cricket Australia chief executive, said national boards were doing what they could to allow their players to take part in the IPL but occasional clashes were unavoidable.

"I think there's a notional window already for the IPL," Sutherland said. "I think it exists. There's an inevitability around some overlap and countries are working around that to the best of their ability. There are challenges ultimately, it's been raised with clashes from time

to time. But I think there's a notional window that most countries are working with and around, in order to allow their players the opportunity to play in IPL.

"It's a wonderful opportunity for cricketers to play in that competition. It's a huge competition and obviously it's very lucrative. It's hard to really stand in the way of that, particularly for countries that are less fortunate than ourselves, perhaps not generating the same amount of money as we are and perhaps not being able to pay their players as much as we are able to here in Australia."

Lorgat was in Melbourne to present Sutherland with the ICC's ODI shield, after Australia finished on top of the one-day international rankings at the end of the 2011-12 season. The Australians are about to embark on a six-match one-day tour of England and Ireland, and by the end of the trip they will have played 52 full international games across all formats in the space of 12 months.

Managing the volume of cricket on international calendars will be one of the challenges for Lorgat's successor at the ICC, David Richardson, who steps into his new position next month. Lorgat said there was no easy solution to overcrowded schedules, given the demand for all three formats.

"There's only 365 days in the year," Lorgat said. "If we could work out how to get more [days in the year] we would have the answer. Volume of cricket is something we all focus on. The only way in my view is for everybody involved to monitor and to ensure that they manage volume. Everybody to me is from the players themselves all the way through to the administrators, with the coaches in between."

"We've just seen last week in the Test match where England ... were resting James Anderson. Rotation is something which certain players are not keen on, understandably so, but I think it's a reality. Unless all of us manage the volume we're not going to get on top of that."
