Garment exporters threaten shutdown

Worker unrest stops production in 300 Ashulia factories for fourth day

Garment owners have threatened to shut down their factories for an indefinite period from Sunday if workers continued their violent pro-

tests, suspending production in the readymade garment belt at Ashulia.

"We'll close all our units first at Ashulia and gradually across the country if the violence continues," Shafiul Islam
