### **CRAB** forms probe committee

Crime Reporters' Association of Bangladesh (CRAB) yesterday formed a committee to investigate the killing of journalist couple Sagar Sarowar and Meherun Runi as law enforcers have yet to solve it after four months.

The CRAB's leaders met with leaders of other journalists' organisations on June 7. The committee was formed following decision in the meetings, said a press release.

Sagar Sarowar, news editor of private TV station Maasranga, and Meherun Runi, a senior reporter at ATN Bangla, were murdered at their flat in the capi-

### Mobs beat 3 in capital

Two alleged extortionists and a mugger were beaten up by mobs in two separate incidents in the capital vesterday.

A mob beat up two of gang of extortionists for demanding toll from a businessman at Scout Market in the city's Paltan area around 1:00pm, police said.

Police rescued the duo, identified as Hanif, 30, and Nasir, 28, and admitted them to Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

Some miscreants demanded Tk 3 lakh from the businessman on Wednesday. Hanif and Nasir came to realise the money on behalf of the criminals yesterday, police said.

Meanwhile, locals beat up a mugger, identified as Humayun Kabir, 28, while fleeing after snatching Tk 2 lakh from a man in Kawran Bazar area around 1:00pm.

Police could not recover the snatched money yet.

## TIB concerned over prevalence of corruption

With a call to intensify the anti-corruption movement for upholding democracy, good governance and human rights, speakers stressed on collective measures of the government, political and civil society members in this regard.

Speakers made the call at the annual meeting of Transparency International Bangladesh (TIB) at a hotel in the capital on Saturday, said a press release.

TIB trustee board Chairman Sultana Kamal said TIB could assist in preventing institutional corruption of different government service providers through constructive instructions.

The meeting ended with a declaration expressing deep concern over the increase in the intensity of corruption in the country.

It emphasised on increasing institutional efficiency of the Anti-Corruption Commission to fight against corruption and on political consensus to solve all disputed matters.

Speakers also demanded proper investigation into the alleged corruption in the Padma Bridge construction and in the recruitment processes in railways and other public services.

They demanded formation of a special bench to dispose off corruption cases.

TIB trustee board former chairman M Hafizuddin Khan and its members Rokia Afzal Rahman and Dr ATM Shamsul Huda addressed the meeting that was moderated by TIB Executive Director Dr Iftekharuzzaman.

### Matia for food autarky STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury yesterday put emphasis on use of local resources to achieve selfsufficiency in food in the country.

"We should ensure the best use of our own resources instead of depending on foreign aids," she said adding, "I request scientists to develop such species of paddy that can survive in the country's flood-hit areas".

Matia was addressing at a workshop titled "Southern Delta Master Plan" jointly organised by Ministry of Agriculture and United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) at Bangladesh Agricultural Research Centre (BARC) in the capital.

Water Resources Minister Ramesh Chandra Sen Fisheries and Livestock Minister Md Abdul Latif Biswas, and FAO Representative to Bangladesh Dominique Burgeon, among others, addressed the programme.

## No forest land for shrimp cultivation

Orders HC

The High Court yesterday directed the authorities concerned to refrain from leasing out any coastal reserved forest land in Cox's Bazar for shrimp cultivation.

In response to a writ petition, the HC also ordered the chief conservator of forests to submit a report in this regard before it in four weeks and prohibited the authorities from leasing out the land till then. The HC bench also issued a rule upon the officials con-

cerned of the government to explain why their decision to lease out the land should not be declared illegal and against the people's interest. Bangladesh Environmental Lawyers Association (Bela)

filed the petition yesterday seeking HC directives on the authorities to protect 7793.54 acres of the reserved forest in Cox's Bazar.

Bela stated in the petition that the Cox's Bazar deputy commissioner (DC) leased out 5,000 acres of the land to 153 people for shrimp cultivation, saying that there are no forests in the land.

Despite objections from the Department of Forests, the DC office continued to lease out the land and sought approval from the Ministry of Land, which gave its permission without holding any scrutiny, read the petition.
