# Myanmar vows 'justice' for victims of unrest

Myanmar yesterday pledged to hunt down those responsible for the deaths of 50 people in communal clashes, as the relief effort was stepped up for tens of thousands displaced by the violence.

More than 30,000 people -- both ethnic Rakhine Buddhists and Muslim Rohingya -have been displaced after homes were set ablaze during riots and revenge attacks in the western state of Rakhine earlier this month, state media says.

The UN warned of the "immense hardship" faced by thousands of families, just as monsoon rains sweep in. Rice, water and shelter is being delivered to the state capital Sittwe, but there are mounting concerns about more remote areas.

Both sides accuse each other of being responsible for the violence, which has torn apart communities that had lived together for many years and overshadowed recent reforms under the quasi-civilian govern-

After visiting the area, a senior Myanmar minister vowed the government "would bring about justice and prosecute offenders without bias", state mouthpiece the New Light of Myanmar reported yesterday.

"Lawlessness is unacceptable," the paper said, quoting Lieutenant-General Thein

Htay, Union Minister for Border Affairs and Myanmar Industrial Development.

"The government will bring offenders to justice and restore stability as soon as possible," he vowed. The unrest has prompted President Thein

Sein to warn of the danger of disrupting the nation's fledgling reform process as Myanmar emerges from decades of military But in Sittwe more immediate concerns

dominate, with the United Nations estimat ing around 10,000 people are badly in need of temporary shelter and food following several days of violence. The military has been joined by non

governmental organisations and local donors in providing food, water and shelter, a Rakhine official said, as thousands spent another night in tents after fleeing their burning homes. Decades of discrimination have left the

Muslim Rohingya stateless and viewed by the United Nations as among the most persecuted minorities on the planet. About 800,000 of them live in Myanmar, according to the UN, mostly in Rakhine.

The Myanmar government considers the Rohingya to be foreigners, while many citizens see them as illegal immigrants from Bangladesh and view them with hos-

#### Nasheed to run for presidency

Former Maldivian leader Mohamed Nasheed, who claims he was ousted in a military coup earlier this year, secured his party's nomination yesterday to be its presidential candidate, the party said.

Nasheed stood unopposed in Saturday's vote but Maldivian Democratic Party rules required him to get the endorsement of at least 10 percent of the 48,000-strong membership.

The former Maldivian leader had gained more than 22,000 votes with half of them counted yesterday, organiser Ibrahim Waheed told reporters.

The European Union as well as the United States and neighbouring India have called for early elections to end the political turmoil in the Indian Ocean archipelago, which is best known for its tourism.

Detective Branch of Police personnel, aided by Rapid Action Battalion, arrested him at the office of Bangla daily Naya Diganta at Motijheel around 3:40pm, said Masudur Rahman, additional deputy commissioner of Dhaka Metropolitan Police.

After the arrest, Kashem, chairman of Diganta Media Corporation, was brought to the cell of the tribunal around 4:10pm. He was sent to jail from there around 6:50pm. He was not produced before the court.

Tajul Islam, a counsel for Kashem, said his defence would appeal for bail.

Earlier in the day, Prosecutor Rana Dasgupta appealed to the tribunal for an arrest order against Kashem and said he had been "threatening witnesses" and that he was a flight risk.

Rana told the threemember tribunal, led by Justice Md Nizamul Huq, that Jamaat leader Kashem was the chief of Chittagong Al-Badr unit during the Liberation War. Al-Badr was one of the forces created to help the Pakistani occupation army and oppose the pro-liberation forces during the war.

During the war, Al-Badr used Mohamaya Dalim Hotel, Kayum Hotel and Goods Hill as its torture cells.

Around noon on November 19, 1971, Kashem took three people to the Mohamaya Dalim Hotel and tortured them, said Rana. One of them was given electric shocks which destroyed his reproductive capability for ever.

Two days later, Al-Badr brought in another person, with his hands and legs tied, from Kadamtali of Chittagong.

"Kashem had asked the victims to call back the freedom fighters from the war or else he would torture him," said Rana. The victim did not comply and he had to go through horrendous

The prosecutor during the proceedings yesterday did not mention any names of the victims, just their initials.

He said through collaborating with the Pakistani army, the Al-Badr killed many and turned many places of Chittagong, including Gahira, Jogotmondalpara, Foy's Lake, Halishahar, Dampara and Unosotturpara into killing fields.

He told the tribunal that Kashem, being a member of the Central Executive Council of the Jamaat-e-Islami, led a propaganda campaign in the UK and the Middle East to foil the ongoing trial of war criminals.

He said Kashem was a highly influential person and he was mounting pressure on witnesses and had threatened them with life if they gave statements to the investigation officer of the case against him.

He said most of his victims were still alive.

As Rana tried to elaborate more on Kashem's alleged crimes, the tribunal stopped him and said it did not need to hear more to issue an

The tribunal around 2:30pm passed the order to arrest and produce him before the court within 24 hours of arrest.

Mir Kashem, 63, son of late Taib Ali, lives in Mirpur. He lived in Harirampur of Manikganj in Chittagong in 1971. He was known as Mintu then. In his youth, he was an activist of the Islami Chhatra Sangha, the then student wing of the Jamaate-Islami.

Six top Jamaat leaders--Ghulam Azam, Matiur Rahman Nizami, Delwar Hossain Sayedee, Ali Ahsan Mojaheed, Kamaruzzaman and Quader Mollah--and two BNP leaders --Salahuddin Quader Chowdhury and Abdul Alim--are now being tried before the tribunals.

increased [in late 2010] they cost Tk 24," she says as she explains why she cannot afford eggs any more. With such a price spiral,

the inflation graph has swung wildly and remains at a high level. On a 12-month average basis, the inflation rate accelerated to 10.76 percent in May, up from 8.67 percent in the same month a year ago, according to the Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS).

Rahima and her fellow workers were shattered by the skyward journey of inflation.

"The workers did not get any benefit of the pay raise as the house owners increased rents four times a year," said a

worker at Ha-Meem Garment at Ashulia on the outskirts of the capital.

Rahima's employer, Arif (again, not his real name), sandwiched between inflation and global financial crisis, also feels helpless.

He found prices of his product -- basic T-shirts -falling to \$2 now from \$4 a piece two years ago, while his interest rate remained high at 15 percent. In a time of high inflation, one cannot expect banks to charge low.

"Inflation is cutting into workers' purchasing power," says Ahsan H Mansur, executive director of the Policy Research Institute, adding that food and housing are the two major expenditure items for the garment work-

A garment worker spends 60 percent of his income on food, which is the same as the national average; and

nearly 25 percent on accommodation, which is 7 percentage points higher than the national average of 18 percent in urban areas, he

Prices of firewood also shot up due to higher demand among the workers in Ashulia in the absence of gas burners.

On November 1, 2010, the wage board for garment industries nearly doubled the minimum wages to about Tk 3,000 a month at the entry level. In dollar terms, the minimum wage was \$43, the lowest in the world, at the exchange rate in 2010, which is now \$36.4, as the taka has lost its value against the dollar.

Facing severe protests by workers over the last six days, the owners of more than 300 garment factories in the industrial hub of Ashulia closed down their units from yesterday for an indefinite period.

The latest spell of labour unrest started with the rumour of the death of Salman, a storekeeper at a unit of Ha-Meem Group, on May 11. Later, Salman was found alive with minor injuries he had suffered in clashes with factory officials. The Salman issue over,
