# Exporters count \$10m loss a day

The shutdown of more than 300 factories at Ashulia in the wake of labour unrest will mean a \$10-million loss in exports for the garment owners there every day.

Twenty percent or \$3.6 billion of the annual garment exports comes from the factories at Ashulia, industry insiders say. This means the amount is about \$300 million a month.

With so many factories shut, it would be difficult to execute orders of the international buyers, said Shafiul Islam Mohiuddin, president of Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters (BGMEA).

"We will lose our international buyers due to the unrest. We will not be able to execute the orders on time. So, the buyers will go to other destinations for making the same clothes," he added.

"The biggest loss of the sector is the eroding of buyers' confidence," he said. "We are suffering from insecurity.... We will reopen the units if the environment is created by the government," Mohiuddin said.

# Road safety steps remain on paper

Slow pace of implementation irks communications minister

Expressing his frustration over the slow implementation of the National Road Safety Council's decisions taken years ago, Communications Minister Obaidul Quader yesterday said he wanted to see tangible progress in this regard.

Presiding over the NRSC's 21st meeting at Rail Bhaban, Quader said, "I am not interested in holding such meetings in future. Rather, I want tangible development in the communications sector, mainly to reduce traffic jam and road accidents."

The council's decisions include putting an end to plying of unfit vehicles and issuance of fake driving licence, renewal of licence regularly, creating a road maintenance fund, enhancing the capacity of road

safety unit and stopping robberies on highways. He advised the officials concerned to be selective in taking up and executing programmes. "Take up a small number of programmes and

## Muhith vows to keep subsidy at tolerable level

Defends money-whitening scope

UNB, Dhaka

The government will be able to keep subsidy at a tolerable level as estimated in the proposed budget for fiscal 2012-13, Finance Minister AMA Muhith categorically said yesterday.


And there will not be any high-level bank borrowing, he added while addressing a budget discussion organised by private satellite channel Desh TV and Prime Bank Ltd at Nabab Nawab Ali Chowdhury Senate Bhaban of Dhaka University in the afternoon.


Referring to a government survey according to which undisclosed money constitutes around 42-82 percent of Bangladesh's economy, Muhith said efforts were underway to bring the undisclosed money to the mainstream of the economy.

In the proposed budget, the government has allowed whitening of black money with a fine of 10 percent.

About the government's alleged inability to utilise foreign aid, he said steps would be taken to utilise more foreign aid.
