Bangladesh suffered their second consecutive defeat in the AFC U-22 Asia Cup Qualifiers when they were beaten 2-1 by Group D favourites Uzbekistan at the Dasrath Stadium in Kathmandu yes-

Smarting from a 4-1 defeat at the hands of Nepal in the first game, Bangladesh adopted a defensive strategy fielding five defenders against Uzbekistan who chose the aerial route to keep Bangladeshi defenders busy throughout the game.

Uzbekistan came close to of taking the lead in the 12th minute when Azamov Rustam ran down the right flank to enter the danger zone and hit the side netting, much to the relief of Bangladesh goalkeeper Shahidul Alam Sohel while eight minutes later Azamov headed a Gadoev header wide of the

Uzbekistan finally broke the deadlock in the 40th minute when Smolyachenkon Pavel headed an Alibobo cross home from the six-yard box on the rain-soaked pitch following nearly 15 minutes of drizzling.

However, Bangladesh hit back in the second half to equalise the margin 10 minutes into the second half when Uzbek defender Fayziev handled a powerful shot of substitute striker Rony and midfielder Emon Babu converted from the spot.

Uzbekistan restored the lead availing a fumble from Bangladesh goalkeeper Sohel, who saw a free-kick from Gadoev from 25 yards slip off his grips which cost Bangladesh three points.

Bangladesh will face Jordan in their third match tomorrow.

Angelo Mathews hammered a brisk 80 not out as Sri Lanka posted a thrilling two-wicket victory over Pakistan in the fifth and final one-day international in Colombo on Monday to clinch the series 3-1. Mathews smashed two

sixes and four boundaries in his 76-ball knock to help his team achieve a 248-run target with two balls to spare in the day-night match. Sri Lanka needed 15 runs

to win in the last over bowled by paceman Mohammad Sami before Mathews completed the win with a four.

Dinesh Chandimal was the other main scorer for Sri Lanka with 54.

Paceman Sohail Tanvir bagged three wickets and leg-spinner Shahid Afridi two to reduce Sri Lanka to 138-6 before Mathews received valuable support from Jeevan Mendis (19) and Nuwan Kulasekara (10 not out) to steer his team home.

Tanvir jolted Sri Lanka Afridic Jayawardene b Kulasekara when he removed openers Tillakaratne Dilshan and Upul Tharanga, but Sangakkara and Chandimal put on 78 for the third wicket.

Pakistan's opener Imran Farhat, playing his first onedayer in four months, earlier cracked an impressive 56 and Umar Akmal an unbeaten 55.

Pakistan batted steadily after losing out-of-form opener Mohammad Hafeez (six), with Azhar Ali (30) and Farhat adding 60 for the second wicket and then Akmal putting on 61 for the fifth wicket with skipper Misbah-ul-Haq (32).

Akmal smashed two sixes and five fours in a 61-ball knock for his 15th halfcentury in one-dayers.

Pakistan's disgraced paceman Mohammed Aamer is looking forward to returning to cricket "as and when possible", the psychologist helping to rehabilitate his career said Monday.

In the first of several counselling sessions Maqbool Sabri, who was hired by the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) to counsel Aamer, said his client appeared "positive and relaxed" despite his fiveyear ban from the game for

cheating. The 20-year-old was found guilty of spot-fixing during a Test at Lord's in 2010, spent three months in a British jail and was banned from the game by the International Cricket Council (ICC).

The ICC also banned pace partner Mohammad Asif and ex-captain Salman Butt, ordering the trio to undergo rehabilitation.

Sabri said Aamer was upbeat in the first of eight to 10 sessions.

"I am very surprised that he was very positive and relaxed during the first session with me on Saturday," Sabri told AFP. "I think that Aamer's lawyer was a positive influence on him and has guided him well."

Oudin claims maiden title

American Melanie Oudin defeated Serb Jelena Jankovic in straight sets to win her first WTA Tour title here on Monday.

Oudin eased to a 6-4, 6-2 victory in a final which had been held over from Sunday after bad weather disrupted the schedule.

Both women had to win two matches on Sunday to reach the title match, and 20-year-old Oudin proved fresher than the 27-year-old former world number one.

Oudin got an early break, but Jankovic broke back before the American regained the initiative following a sloppy game from the Serb and she closed out the opening set before tak-

ing a 2-0 lead in the second. Jankovic rarely threatened a comeback as Oudin, who has received a wild card for Wimbledon after dropping to 208th in the world rankings from a high of 31st, eased over the line in one hour and 35 minutes.
