















THEATRE FESTIVAL ON LIBERATION WAR

Tales of torture

Countless Bangladeshis faced brutal torture at the hands of the Pakistani Army and its collaborators during the Liberation War. Some of the fourth day's plays at the ongoing Theatre Festival on the Liberation War significantly highlighted that aspect.

In their ranks were Shanglaap Group Theatre's "Manab Surat", Rangpur Shilpakala Academy's "Bhru Tang Tang" and Cox's Bazar City College's "Daam Diye Kinechhi Bangla". These three plays along with several more were staged on July 6 at

the Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy as part of the Theatre Festival. Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy in association with Bangladesh Group Theatre Federation has organised the fortnight-long event.

Shanglaap staged the play at the National Theatre Hall in the evening. The play has been written and directed by Rafiqul Alam. Mainly depicting the life of a villager, the play focuses on the Liberation War through the memories of other villagers. Brutality by the collaborators on youngsters and women comes forth in those reminiscences.

Rangpur Shilpakala Academy's "Bhru Tang Tang" is a more artistic presentation that focuses on the Liberation War through the struggle of people from indigenous communities. Written by Tanvir Ahmed the play, is directed by Reza Arif. The play was staged at the Experimental Theatre Hall.

"Bhru Tang Tang" mainly sheds light on the torture of Santal and Oraon communities living in the northern part of the country. Their upsurge only with bows and arrows epitomises their bravery and des-



On the other hand, Cox's Bazar City College's "Daam Diye Kinechhi Bangla" is a story of a woman during the War. Written and directed by Swapan Bhattacharya, the play narrates the story of how an ordinary woman gradually evolved into a Freedom Fighter. The Razakar's conspiracy comes forth as the woman killed her husband who was a collaborator and joined the liberation forces.

As it was Friday, plays were staged all day long starting from the morning. Among other plays staged on the day were "Shadhinata" (Govt. City College, Chittagong), "Ekatturer Andhakar" (Panchagarh MR College) and "Aguner Chhaya" (Mahmudul Hasan College, Tangail).

Today troupes from Chittagong, Khagrachhari, Bandarban, Barisal, Gaibandha, Rangpur, Bagerhat, Feni and Rajshahi will stage plays.

Emotional intelligence

Today is the first death anniversary of painter Aminul Islam. On the occasion, artists, social and cultural activists, writers will place wreaths at his grave at Banani Graveyard in the city. A number of art institutes and galleries will also organise discussions on his life and immense contribution to the world Islam is one of the senior most and acclaimed

painters in our country. Among Islam's contemporaries were Hamidur Rahman, Bazle Moula Imdad Hossain, Khaled Chowdhury, Loknath Dhor and Ali Humayun (first batch of the Government College of Arts and Crafts, later renamed Faculty of Fine Arts, University of Dhaka in 1948). The group

was very committed and most of them were involved in left leaning politics. Their preferred themes were nature, urban life and surrounding atmosphere.

At the time, Dacca (now Dhaka) was a quiet city and had lots of green spaces. Painters frequently visited the Buriganga river, Waiz Ghat and other scenic spots for inspiration. Zainul Abedin particularly stressed on drawing and successfully gave Islam and his comrades an understanding of this genre of art and its various significant aspects. The students also portrayed political chaos, economic crises, city life, rural life, still life and other subjects. Some of them were greatly influenced by internationally acclaimed impressionist

Among his contemporaries, Islam made an imme contribution by introducing modern paintings in Bangladesh. "Painting, for me, is the best way to knowledge, the best means to participate profoundly in global life," Islam used to say. The painter also said, "Painters are of two kinds one

Then he went to Florence, Italy to pursue higher studies in art. His three years there proved very formative, as he found answers to many of the questions he had earlier about art and aesthetics.

After moving back to Dhaka, Islam's style underwent a fundamental change. Lines, colours and space became the prime focus in his paintings. Throughout his chequered career, he frequently returned to the Islam had grown primarily as a non-figurative

painter since the early 1960s and started to experiment with different mediums and art forms. Besides painting, Islam also preferred drawing. In the course of his career, he developed several styles, particularly in his drawings and sketches. His figure-based works from the mid-1960s are remarkable; mainly "Homage to Khajuraho", an erotic drawing series focusing on the physical relationship between males and females. The series articulates the proper emotion and fantasy of human beings. The drawings appear serene and the lines have been meticulously done.

Gradually Islam became increasingly aware of the different qualities of lines produced by pen, pencil, brush, bamboo, discarded brush and other objects. The powerful drawings reveal his mastery over lines and superb composition skills. He also did murals in differ-


The title winner will receive Taka 10 lakh and a brand new car while first and second runners-up will be given Taka 5 and 3 lakh respectively.


