Today is the 11th death anniversary of eminent journalist and author Mahbub Anam, former editor of The Bangladesh

In a distinguished career as a journalist, he also served as a senior executive of the then Pakistan Observer and senior vice-president of the Bangladesh Editors Council.

He was actively involved with Bangladesh Sangbadpatra Parishad, Bangladesh Press Council and Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha Porichalona Board. Mahbub Anam, for con-

tributions to journalism, received the Swadhinata Padak, Sher-e-Bangla Gold Medal, Moulana Akram Khan Gold Medal, Kaloddhani Padak and Tribhuj Gold Medal.

Besides, in a long and successful professional career, he also served as the general manager of Jamuna Oil Company and director of Bangladesh Petroleum Corporation.

Mahbub Anam was actively involved in politics from his student life.

In addition to being the general secretary of Salimullah Muslim Hall of Dhaka University in 1954-55, he was appointed acting publication secretary of Jukta Front on behalf of Awami League in 1954.

Mahbub Anam actively took part in the Language Movement of 1952.

He was jailed several times for his role in the movement as general secretary of Tamaddun Majlish, Mymensingh unit, joint secretary of the Rashtrabhasha Sangram Parishad and general secretary of Salimullah Muslim

Hall. In recognition of his contribution to the language movement, he was awarded the "Bhasha Andoloner Bir Sainik Padak" by the then president, Ziaur Rahman, and Matribhasha Padak (posthumously) by

Tamaddun Majlish. Mahbub Anam authored a number of books on the cultural and political identity of Bangladesh including "Amra Bangladeshi Amra Bangalee" and "Itihasher

Shikriti Bonam Bikriti". He also served as the president of Nattyamancho Bangladesh and Bangladesh Sahitya Sangskriti Kendro and was actively involved with Bangladesh Film Censor Board and Bangladesh Public Library

Says education minister

After the successful application of creative question method in 21 subjects at secondary level, the government has decided to introduce the question method in mathematics and higher mathematics in future, said Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid

yesterday. "The creative system has had a positive impact on the education system," he said while speaking at a workshop organised by Secondary Education Sector Development Project (SESDP) held at National Academy for Educational Management (NAEM) in the capital.

Nahid said the students and teachers are no longer afraid of the question method.

The system was introduced in a bid to stop students from depending on memorising, he said, adding that questions that still

remain about the teaching and formulation of the creative question method can be addressed in the coming days. "Although there was scepticism among

some people about the method but now they are happy as the method has brought a positive change in education in the country," Nahid added. Sources said the ministry would apply the

method in mathematics and higher mathematics on the basis of the recommendations of the workshop.

In 2010, the method was introduced in two subjects -- Bangla and Religion Studies -in the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examination and now the method is being applied in 21 subjects.

The method will be introduced in Chemistry, Civics, and Business Policy in 2013 and in 2014 it will be applied in eight more subjects.

48 men rescued from trafficking

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab-7) rescued 48 men, who were told that they would be sent to Malaysia, and arrested two persons in this connection from Kadamtali area of Chittagong city early yesterday.

The arrestees were Mohammad Suruzzaman, 43, running human trafficking business through Al-Bismillah International Travels, and his nephew Md Jahirul, 39, both from Enayetpur area of Chauhali upazila in Sirajgonj district.

Acting on a tip-off, a team of Rab-7 conducted raids on four hotels, rescued the men and nabbed the traffickers, said Major Rakibul Amin, deputy director of Rab-7 and company commander of Crime Prevention Specialised Company of the battalion.

The rescued were from Sirajganj, Tangail, Naogaon, Jhenidah, Magura and Pabna, Rab sources said.

Most of them were weavers and others were farmers, grocers and unemployed persons.

The rescued men told Rab personnel that Suruzzaman had taken money from them by assuring them that they would be sent to Malaysia and provided with jobs there. Suruzzaman said he would just make arrangement for the

48 men to board a ship yesterday morning and did not know

what would happen afterwards. He has been living in Malaysia since 1996 and is in human

trafficking business across Sirajgonj and other adjoining districts for the last two years, told Suruzzaman to The Daily
