4 govt agencies succeed in e-procurement

Four key government agencies have successfully completed piloting of electronic government procurement (e-GP) at identified procuring entities, said a World Bank release yesterday. The agencies are Roads and Highways Department, Local

Government Engineering Department, Rural Electrification Board and Bangladesh Water Development Board. Now, electronic procurement is set to be rolled out at a

much wider scale in these agencies, in a step towards bringing more transparency and accountability in the public procurement system.

These agencies are also piloting procurement performance monitoring system, the release said.

The World Bank (WB) is supporting Bangladesh to introduce electronic public procurement through Public Procurement Reform Project (PPRP II).

A WB team recently reviewed the status of PPRP II and noted that the project is progressing well with positive contributions towards improving transparency and competitiveness of the system. The WB has provided \$24 million concessionary interest-

free credit for the project which will be completed in March 2013. Over 80 percent of the committed amount has already been disbursed. The Central Procurement Technical Unit (CPTU) under

the Implementation Monitoring and Evaluation Division of the government has been implementing the project in coordination with the four key agencies.

The WB team highlighted the need for strengthening CPTU with adequate staffing and enhancing efforts for expeditious rolling out of e-GP and procurement monitoring at the four agencies.

Stop graft in teachers' recruitment

DCs urge at conference

Alleging that teachers' recruitment process at non-government educational institutions is plagued with "corruption and irregularities", deputy commissioners (DCs) yesterday called for a stop to this practice to ensure recruitment of competent teachers.

They pointed out problems and gave suggestions to this end at the "DC Conference on the Education Ministry and the Primary and Mass Education Ministry" held at the Cabinet Division yesterday, said meeting sources.

A lot of money changes hands during the teachers' recruitment process and such a practice should be stoppes, they added.

Some 16 DCs participated the interactive session with Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid, Primary and Mass Education Minister Afsarul Ameen and State Minister for Primary and Mass Education Motahar Hossain.

The DCs of Khulna, Narshingdi and Kishoreganj districts suggested that a district-based recruitment board or central service commission headed by the DCs can be formed to appoint competent teachers at non-government educational institutions.

Some other DCs suggested following the recruitment process of government primary schools in recruiting teachers for nongovernment schools.

The education minister informed the DCs

that they are undertaking a process to form a separate body like PSC to recruit teachers.

Standard education is being disrupted and corruption is spreading as the people from non-government level are being nominated as the heads of the school managing committees (SMC) or governing bodies of private schools, the DCs said.

They suggested nominating government officials as the heads of the SMCs.

Few DCs opposed the appointment of

Some proposed to fix a minimum educational eligibility for the heads of the SMCs.

education cadres in different administrative posts as, they said, this created scarcity of teachers. Some DCs proposed to be given authority to enquiry into any allegation about educa

tional institutions and take action against it. Previously, they could not take action against any institution despite getting different allegations, they said. The DC of Netrokona said the rate of stipend recipients in his district is 45 percent while the

rate in Mymensingh is 90 percent. He suggested to brining equity in the stipend recipients. Some DCs suggested giving 100 percent

stipends in the haor and baor regions. Talking to reporters, Nahid said they will

consider the issues raised by the DCs.

On nominating government officials as the heads of SMC, he said the head of SMC would be nominated as per the existing rules.

'Fraudulence' Outsourcing company offices vandalised

Defrauded clients of an online outsourcing company yesterday vandalised its two office buildings in the capital's Dhanmondi protesting officials' "sudden disappearance."

Witnesses said the clients also blocked Satmasjid road for half an hour and vandalised a bus.

BDS Click Centre, also an MLM company which assures of "earning through online', on Satmasjid road and its sister concern BDS Security Services on road no-8/A of Dhanmondi were ransacked during the agitation.

The clients alleged that all staff of BDS Click have disappeared from the office.

The officials acted suspicious which was observed after visiting the office recently, said Syed Nifad, a client. Nifad said he opened 34

accounts at Tk 47,600 three months back. In the first month, he could withdraw money from the account but then the company officials showed a dilly-dally approach.

The victims told The Daily Star that the MLM company charged them Tk 700 to Tk 2,100 for opening an account by offering ways of earning easily Tk 2,100 to Tk 21,000 by clicking on websites, after taking advance payment from them.

Police said they sealed BDS Click Centre office from where a firearm was also recovered. The clients have filed two cases against the BDS Click officials.

The BDS Click Managing Director Md Zillur Rahman and Director Faruk Ahamed were not available for comments in this regard.

13 killed, 41 hurt in road accidents

Thirteen people were killed and fortyone others injured in road accidents in Dhaka, Barguna, Comilla, Rajbari, Sirajganj, Chapainawabganj, Dinajpur, Kurigram and Madaripur yesterday.

Staff correspondent reports, Ha-Meem Group General Manager (production) Moktar Hossain, 45, was killed when a bus crushed him on Nabinagar-Kaliakoir road at Palashbari in Ashulia on the outskirts of the capital yesterday morning.

Angry locals vandalised the bus following the accident.

Our Patuakhali correspondent reports, two people died when their motorbike carrying them hit a tree beside Patuakhali-Kuakata road at Urshitala in Amtoli upazila of Barguna district yesterday.

The victims are Moshiur Rahman, 32, a police constable, and Joni

Talukder, 35, of Barisal town. UNB from Comilla says, two people were killed and two others injured when a truck rammed a CNG-run auto-rickshaw at Beltali in the sadar upazila in the early hours

of yesterday.

One of the deceased is Akter Hossain, 25, driver of the autorickshaw. In Rajbari, Tania Akhter, 4, daughter

Injured Shafiar Rahman, 26, was rushed to the upazila health complex. In Madaripur, farmer Ratan Sheikh,

Yunus has no

Says US envoy

US Ambassador to Dhaka Dan Mozena yesterday ruled out any link of Prof Muhammad Yunus with the scrapping of the Padma bridge loan agreement by the World Bank. Asked whether the issue of Prof Yunus's removal from the

Grameen Bank by the government influenced the World Bank to cancel its loan commitment, Mozena said, "It is wrong...it is really very wrong. There is no link between them."

He also ruled out any involvement of the United States behind the World Bank's decision to not fund the Padma bridge construction.

"I was very disappointed that the World Bank chose to

and the Bangladesh government were not able to proceed with this critical project. "I know investigation is on in Canada," he said. Replying to a question whether the United States will play

any role in reopening dialogue between the World Bank and the Bangladesh government, Mozena said he is trying to get better understanding of the process. "US is not part of the crisis...this is an issue between the World Bank and the Bangladesh government," he added.

"I must hope that the Bangladesh government and the World Bank can find a way to meet each other's needs," he said, reiterating that the US always supports the construction of Padma bridge.

Meanwhile, a senior official of Japan International Cooperation Agency (Jica) in Dhaka yesterday said they are seriously watching what steps Bangladesh is taking about alleged corruption involving the Padma bridge project.

Jica Senior Representative Kei Toyama said this while talking to reporters at the New Haripur Power Plant Project in Narayanganj.

Japan is seriously considering the corruption issue involving the Padma bridge project, he said.

However, Deputy Prime Minister of Japan Katsuya Pkada at a meeting with Foreign Minister Dipu Moni in Tokyo on Monday conveyed that the Padma bridge project could be undertaken under a new framework of donor arrangement as World Bank has cancelled its funding commitment in the project.

He assured the foreign minister that Japan would pursue the donor groups including the Asian Development Bank to embark at a negotiated settlement in respect of the project.

Jica President Akihiko Tanaka also during a meeting with Dipu Moni in Tokyo on Monday expressed regret at the World Bank's decision.
