'Amend house rent control act'

It is necessary to amend the house rent control act of 1991 to prevent landlords in the capital from charging excessive rent, speakers said at a seminar yesterday.

Jatiya Bharatiya Kalyan Society organised the seminar styled "Make house rent control act effective after amending it" at the Jatiya Press Club.

In the last 22 years, no government has taken the initiative to make the act time befitting, said Advocate Manzill Murshid, president of Human Rights and Peace for Bangladesh (HRPB).

He said that they submitted a writ petition to the High Court to make an existing rent chart, which shows rent based on area, effective.

The organisers placed a seven-point demand yesterday including area based standard rent following the house rent control act, appointing rent controller, deputy controller and assistant controller to monitor the standard rent.

2 Dhaka College students stabbed

Dhanmondi police said the attack might be launched over a feud.

The injured took treatment at Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

Mazharul Islam laid to rest

Legendary architect Mazharul Islam was laid to rest at Martyred Intellectuals' Graveyard in the capital's Mirpur yesterday.

Earlier, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina visited his Gulshan residence in the afternoon to pay him a last tribute.

His body was brought to the Fine Arts Institute of Dhaka University (DU) around 12:00 noon where friends, colleagues and well-wishers paid him their last tributes.

His first namaz-e-janaza was held after Zohr prayers at DU Central Mosque where he was accorded a guard of honour by a police contingent.

His second namaz-e-janaza was held at

Azad Mosque in Gulshan after Asr prayers. He was buried around 8:00pm.

People from all walks of life as well as different organisations expressed deep shock at his death and prayed for the departed soul.

The master architect, born on December 25, 1923, in Murshidabad, passed away at a hospital in the capital early yesterday.

Nutrition services in poor condition

Roundtable told

Although the government has made much progress in some indices of health sector, progress in providing nutrition services to the people still lagging behind in the country, said Senior Secretary of Health and Family Welfare Ministry Md Humayun Kabir yesterday.

"The government has taken some effective measures to enhance the progress in health sector, and it has also achieved some successes in some indices like reduction of maternal and infant death rates," he said.

"But failures to speed up the progress in providing nutrition services pull down the success in the health sector", he added.

Humayun Kabir made the remarks at a roundtable on

"Role of nutrition in increasing good health and working

capacity of the women" jointly organised by Plan Bangladesh, a non-government organisation (NGO), and Bangla daily Prothom Alo in the latter's office. Joint editor of the daily Prothom Alo Abdul Quayum moderated the roundtable where Dr Makhduma Nargis, additional secretary at the health ministry; Prof Khandaker

M Sefayet Ullah, director general of Health Department; AKM Amir Hossain, director general of Family Planning Department; Prof Md Ekhlasur Rahman, director of National Nutrition Institution; Plan Bangladesh's Deputy Country Director Anwar Hossain Shikder, and Program Manager Takseen Chowdhury, among others, also spoke.

Speakers at the roundtable said country's women often suffer from different diseases due to lack of quality diet and adolescent pregnancy.

Dr Makhduma Nargis stressed bringing nutrition services to the mainstream of health services provided by the govern-

Community clinics can play a significant role in providing the nutrition services in the country, she said.

The government and non-government organisaitons need to work together to ensure the health services to the country's women, she said adding that women should be considered as an important productive workforce.

Prof Sefayet Ullah said activities for raising awareness among people about importance of nutritious food should be increased in the country.

Takseen Chowdhury said country's around 30 percent women suffer from malnourishment, while 15 percent of them suffer from stunted growth for lack of nutrition.

Country made free of terrorism: PM

Hasina said Bangladesh has the third largest population in the Muslim world and maintains solidarity with the Islamic Ummah.

Dr Abdulaziz Othman Altwaijri invited Hasina to attend the upcoming IESCO conference in Azerbaijan in November next.

HC orders N'ganj DC to investigate 'wrongful jailing'

The High Court yesterday ordered the Narayanganj deputy Progressive Democratic Party will form commissioner to investigate an allegation of imprisoning a a human chain; Venue: in front of Jatiya man mistaken to be a murder convict and submit a report to it in this regard by July 30.

The imprisoned man, Zakir Hossain, was produced before the HC bench of Justice AHM Shamsuddin Choudhury Manik and Justice ABM Altaf Hossain yesterday as per its June 21 order.

On that day, the HC bench had also issued a rule asking the officials concerned to explain in two weeks why keeping the man detained should not be declared illegal.

The rule came following a newspaper report placed before the court by Advocate KM Saifuddin.

The report headlined, "Ekjoner jabojjibon khatchhen onnojon" (one man's life sentence is being served by another), was published in the Bangla daily Bangladesh Protidin that day. The report says Md Zakir Hossain, son of Shamsul

Haque of Hathkholapara under Araihazar thana in Narayanganj, was serving the jail sentence of another man, Zakir Hossain, son of Shamsuddin of Beparipara village of the thana. The sentence came over the murder of one, Bikchan

Mia, by some muggers at Bajobi of Araihazar on November 11, 1991.

Police had submitted a charge-sheet implicating Shamsuddin's son Zakir in May, 1992 and the District and Sessions Judge of Narayanganj passed the sentence on November 23, 1996 with the convict in absentia. said the report. Afterwards, police, on December 10, 2007,

arrested Md Zakir while the real convict remained at large, it added. Yesterday, Zakir told the HC bench that he was arrested by

police on November 27, 2007 from the capital's Paltan area and he had no idea about the conviction. Deputy Attorney General Amit Talukder read out a letter

from Kashimpur Jail Senior Jail Super Jahangir Kabir before the court. In it, Jahangir stated that police had confirmed the identification of the imprisoned man.

Afterwards, the HC bench asked the authorities concerned of Narayanganj District and Sessions Judge's Court to submit the case record before it by July 30 and the jail authorities to produce the man before it that day.
