

Terror financed due to HSBC failure

US probe into British bank's operation in Bangladesh exposes links of 2 local Islamic banks

Islami Bank Bangladesh Ltd and spotlight yesterday for their alleged links to terrorist financing after a US Senate report exposed British banking giant HSBC's internal governance failure to control flows of suspect funds.



A blast, some questions

A woman was injured when a bomb exploded in her handbag in the capital's Agargaon yesterday. Police suspect the explosive was activated by a mobile phone.

Police detained the injured, Ayesha Siddique, assistant programme officer of

Bangladesh Computer Council (BCC), and her colleague Zubayer Ahmed and one Nurul Islam in this connection.

During primary interrogation, Zubayer confessed to planting the explosive in Ayesha's bag "to teach her a lesson". He claimed he had a romantic relationship

with Ayesha but they had been coming up against some issues recently, said Zakir Hossain Mollah, officer-in-charge of Sher-e-Bangla Nagar Police Station.

Zubayer bought the bomb from Nurul Islam for Tk 20,000, police said, quoting Zubayer.

Ayesha, 31, was undergoing treatment at the National

Institute of Traumatology and Orthopaedic Rehabilitation (Nitor) under police custody.

She told The Daily Star that Zubayer, programme officer at BCC, called her over her mobile phone, asking her to meet him

WAR CRIMES TRIAL

Witness testifies in camera for first time

For the first time at the international crimes tribunals, a witness testified and was cross-examined behind closed doors yesterday.

In the case against Jamaat leader Abdul Quader Mollah at the three-member International Crimes Tribunal-2, the traumatised female witness deposed in camera in front of three prosecutors and defence lawyers each, court officials and the accused.

Her cross-examination will resume today.

Mohammad Ali, the conducting prosecutor of the case, yesterday told reporters that a female prosecution witness had given testimony before the tribunal and defence counsels had crossexamined her in camera.

"As the case proceedings were held in camera, we cannot disclose what happened or what was said in the courtroom," said Mohammad Ali.
