Afterwards, the victims' son, AKM Shahjahan, filed a murder case against Jewel.



Kuakata antique boat to be excavated

The antique boat that recently surfaced from beneath the Kuakata beach in Patuakhali will be excavated and restored during winter when the sea water recedes, archaeologists and experts in Dhaka said yesterday.

Meanwhile, a police camp has been set up on the site of the wreck to prevent theft and looting, Additional Deputy Commissioner of Patuakhali Amol Krishna Mondol told The Daily Star. The ancient boat,

which is believed to be belonging to the first Rakhine settlers from Arakan province in Myanmar over 200 years ago, was found on June 29 during low tide.

The Department of Archaeology officials in Dhaka confirmed that they have urged the concerned ministry for forming a technical committee to oversee the excavation and restoration of the boat.

"Our team that visited the site recently has assessed a cost of Tk 2 to 3 lakh to excaministry," said an official of the department requesting not to be named.

EXTORTION CASE HC extends Tarique's bail for six months

The High Court (HC) yesterday extended bail for six months to BNP leader Tarique Rahman in an extortion case filed during the regime of military-backed caretaker government.

The HC bench of Justice Salma Masud Chowdhury and Justice Md Mozibur Rahman Miah passed the order following a petition filed by Tarique through his lawyers seeking the bail extension.

Amin Ahmed, owner of Al-Amin Construction, a concern of Amin Mohammad Foundation, had filed the case with Gulshan Police Station on March 8, 2007, against Tarique on charge of extort-

ingTk1crore. In 2008, the HC granted bail to Tarique in this case and later on extended the order of bail at different times. The HC's latest extension order of bail was scheduled to end today.

Tarique, senior vicechairman of the main opposition BNP and son of its Chairperson Khaleda Zia, is now in London for treatment.

Advocate AHM Kamruzzaman appeared for Tarique before the court.

SCHOOL CURRICULUM Gender, social equality to be added as subject

A new subject will be added in the curriculum for class VIII students from next year to teach children about gender and social equality, revealed a convention of education specialists yesterday.

Dr Siddiqur Rahman, consultant at National Curriculum and Textbook Board (NCTB), made the announcement in response to a call of gender sensitisation of textbooks, at a meeting organised by Bangladesh Nari Progoti Shangha in the capital.

He stated that the new subject, called "Professional and Life-related Education", aims to eradicate gender discrimination and social hierarchy. "We want to teach children that rickshaw pulling is just as

respectable a profession as being a doctor or engineer," said Siddiqur Rahman. "We also want to make them gender sensitive and believe both genders are equal," he said. The subject will also include crucial topics such as

puberty, as well as reproductive and sexual health. Manusher Jonno Foundation urged the government to include more indigenous representations.

Proper implementation of TRM projects urged

Waterlogging in Southwest Region

Procedural delay and mismanagement by local administrations in implementing the Tidal River Management (TRM) projects have triggered the persistent waterlogging in the country's southwest region, said local lawmakers and local people yesterday.

They were speaking at a seminar styled Drainage Congestion in the Southwest Region of Bangladesh" jointly organised by Institute of Water Modelling (IWM), Delta Alliance Bangladesh Wing, and Bangladesh Water Partnership in the capital's Biam auditorium.

Urging the government to implement the TRM projects soon, they said the government should find a permanent solution to the problem.

They also demanded easing of the process of compensation disbursement given

by the government. 'The government must implement the project to save the people from permanent

waterlogging," said Shaikh Abdul Wohab, a ruling Awami League (AL) lawmaker from

Jessore-6 constituency.

Tipu Sultan, another AL lawmaker from Jessore-5 constituency, said the government should involve locals in implementing the

Speaking on the occasion, Water Resources Minister Ramesh Chandra Sen said the government will implement the project soon and make easy the compensa-

tion disbursement process. Prof M Monowar Hossain, executive director of IWM, chaired the seminar while State Minister for Water Resources Mahbubur Rahman, KAM Shahiduzzaman, director general of Bangladesh Water Development

Board, among others, also spoke. The TRM is an indigenous water management system that allows tidal water to flow into the wetlands and river basin, and rolling back of the water when the tide subsides.

10-YR-OLD RAPE ACCUSED

HC orders boy's release from safe home

The High Court yesterday directed the authorities concerned to release a 10year-old child from his illegal detention in a Gazipur safe home, in connection with a rape case, and send

him to his parents. While hearing a rule to examine the legality of the detention as per a July 9 writ petition, the court, however, said the case filed against the child will run in accordance with relevant laws.

The authorities of National Juvenile Development Centre, where the child was sent on June 27, produced the child before the HC bench of Justice M Moazzam Husain and Justice Md Habibul Gani yesterday as per its July 9 order.

A July 4 report on Bangla daily Jugantor said police arrested the child on June 17 over the case filed with Begumganj Police Station under the Women and Child Repression Prevention Act.

The petition, filed by Sultana Kamal, executive director of Ain O Salish Kendra, as public interest litigation, stated that the detention was illegal as a child cannot be implicated and detained in any case as per relevant laws and rules.

On July 9, the court had also issued a rule upon the government officials concerned asking why the detention should not be declared illegal as the child had not attained sufficient maturity of understanding to judge the nature and consequence of his conduct.
