DU admission tests begin Oct 12

The admission tests for honours programmes in Dhaka University (DU) under 2012-2013 academic session will begin on October 12.

The decision came at a deans' committee meeting headed by Vice-Chancellor Prof AAMS Arefin Siddique yesterday. The admission tests under the five units for five

The admission tests under the five units for five faculties--Science, Humanities, Business Studies, Social Science (Unit Change) and Fine Arts--will be held on October 12, 19, November 2, 9 and 16 respectively.

The VC said applicants have to apply online like the previous year. Application forms would be available on the university website from August 26 till September 15, he added.

Requirements for the admission tests will remain the same like previous year. Students have to pay a total of Tk 330 for the registration, which includes Tk 30 for online application charge.

9 business organisations fined

Ecnec okays Tk 660cr for urban healthcare

The Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (Ecnec) yesterday approved primary healthcare project for the urban poor especially for women and children involving Tk 660 crore.

The approval came at the first Ecnec meeting of the current financial year with Ecnec Chairperson and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina was in the chair at the NEC Conference room in the capital's Sher-e-Bangla Nagar.

Apart from the primary healthcare project, the Ecnec also approved seven other development projects, involving Tk 2,323 crore all together.

"Of the total project cost, Tk 1,739 crore will come from the national exchequer while Tk 584 crore will come as project assistance," acting Planning Division Secretary Bhuiyan Shafiqul Islam told reporters after the meeting.

Under the project titled "Urban primary healthcare services delivery", all the city corporations, including Rangpur, and four selected Pourashavas of the country will come under primary healthcare services.

Under supervision of the city corporation and pourashava authorities, selected partner non-government organizations (NGOs) will provide the service delivery.

Local Government Division will implement the project. ADB, SIDA and UNFPA will provide Tk 584 crore for the 5-year project. The Ecnec meeting approved another project called "construction of small bridges/culverts on rural roads (3rd phase) project." Under the project, more than 30,000 metre culverts will be constructed on rural roads of 459 upazillas of the country.

Replying to a query on an alleged corruption report on construction of a colony for the sweepers submitted by Implementation Monitoring and Evaluation Division (IMED) before the Ecnec, the acting planning secretary said the authorities of the then Dhaka City Corporation did not take any measure regarding the corruption.

He said that the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) would take necessary measures to this end after proper inquiry.

Other projects approved in the meeting are: Infrastructure facility development of Khulna Engineering and Technology University project (Tk 52 crore); procurement of modern equipment and facilities for Border Guard Bangladesh (Revised) project (Tk. 46 crore); establishment of Shaheed Syed Nazrul Islam Medical College and Hospital, Kishoreganj project' (Tk. 545 crore); construction of two bridges over Brahmaputra River of Islampur Upazilla under Jamalpur district project (Tk 143 crore); new Dakatia and old Dakatia - small Feni river extraction (3rd revised) project (Tk 148 crore) and development of water supply system in Rajshahi city project (Tk 34 crore).

PM leaves for UK today

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will leave Bangladesh for UK today for a five-day visit to attend the opening ceremony of London Olympic Games 2012.

She will lead a 38-member delegation, which includes Foreign Minister Dipu Moni, Ambassador-at-Large Mohammad Ziauddin, officials of Prime Minister's Office and foreign ministry, and media teams.

She is scheduled to reach London Heathrow Airport at 3:30pm (London time).

During her stay in London, Hasina is scheduled to hold bilateral meetings with the British government high-ups and opposition leaders, Commonwealth secretary general, British lawmakers and other participating head of governments at the Olympic games.

On the first day of her visit, she will attend an Ifter party and

On the first day of her visit, she will attend an Iftar party and exchange views with Bangla print and electronic media based in UKat Hotel St. Pancras Renaissance, where she will be staying.
On Thursday, Commonwealth Secretary General

Kamalesh Sharma will call on Hasina at the hotel.

The prime minister will attend a royal reception in

Buckingham Palace at 4:00pm on Friday. Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II will host the reception. Hasina will then leave for Olympic Stadium to witness the

opening ceremony of London Olympics.
Later on July 28, British Secretary of State William Hague

will call on Hasina.
The premier is expected to return home on July 30.

Meanwhile, Awami League Presidium Member Syeda Sajeda Chowdhury and its Joint General Secretary Mahbubul Alam Hanif will act as president and general secretary of the ruling party in absence of party chief Sheikh Hasina and its General Secretary Syed Ashraful Islam.

Ashraf, also LGRD and Cooperatives minister, has already gone to London to meet his family there.

4 buses vandalised over fare

London-based think tank urges protection for Rohingyas

London-based anti-extremist think tank, Quilliam, has called for urgent action by the international community to end violence and discrimination against the Rohingya and other ethnic and religious minorities in Myanmar.

In a statement issued yesterday, it said the current communal violence and ongoing state-sponsored systematic discrimination against the Rohingya minority in Burma required a strong response by the international community and by democracy and human rights activists worldwide.

For decades, the Rohingya, a Muslim ethnic group primarily based in Arakan State and one of the world's most persecuted minorities, have faced severe restrictions, harassment and intimidation. Rohingya activists have been routinely subjected to arbitrary arrest, torture, and even extrajudicial killings perpetrated by the security forces and Rakhine Buddhists.

The Rohingya have effectively been declared stateless in violation of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights by the 1982 Citizenship Act, which removed their citizenship granted in 1948, even if they have lived in Myanmar for generations.

Since a state of emergency was declared in June 2012, targeted attacks by the security forces against the Rohingya have increased and anti-Muslim communal violence has continued unchecked.

Hundreds are thought to have died in the recent violence. In addition, UN agencies say that at least 90,000 people have been displaced and are in desperate need of humanitarian aid.

In the meantime, Myanmar President Thein Sein's suggestion to the UN refugee agency (UNHCR) last week that it should take responsibility for the entire Rohingya population of almost a million until they can be resettled to third countries is appalling and may amount to a policy of ethnic cleansing.

Quilliam has called on the international community to demand that the Myanmar government immediately repeal the 1982 Citizenship Law, which removed basic rights from the Rohingya. "We call on the UK, US & EU governments to urgently press

the Government of Burma to end all systematic discrimination and human rights violations against the Rohingya and other ethnic and religious minorities," said Usama Hasan, a senior researcher at Quilliam. "In addition, the perpetrators of communal violence must be held accountable and swift steps must be taken to resolve the conflict justly."
