Later, they swooped on BNP leader Abdul Gafur and stabbed him indiscriminately with sharp weapons, leaving him critically injured.

Much revered by locals, yet remains neglected

A Shaheed Minar built in the compound of Ghagoa MB High School in Sadar upazila about a decade ago, itself tells the tale of indifference by the authorities.

Used by locals on different national days, the condition of the lone Shaheed Minar in Ghagoa union worsened further recently after the school authorities removed some concretes of the floor and stairs to shift it to another location.

The school committee took no initiative to reconstruct it despite repeated request by the local people besides teachers, students and guardians.

Ghagoa union parishad recently allocated Tk lakh for its reconstruction but the headmaster halted the renovation work, alleged a few teachers and students.

Aminuzzaman Rinku, chairman of the union, said "We had fixed June 29 for laying the foundation stone of a new Shaheed Minar at the same loca-

tion, but the school authorities foiled it for unknown reason".

Md Hamid Sikder, president of the school managing committee, said the headmaster stopped the repair work of the Shaheed Minar without any consultation with the school committee.

Headmaster Mahbub Alam Kote said he wanted to shift the Shaheed Minar to another place as the space at the present location is too small to accommodate a large gathering of local people.

Joypurhat college closed after JCD-BCL clash

Joypurhat Government College was yesterday declared closed until July 31 following a clash between the activists of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) and Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) on the campus.

College sources said the clash was a sequel to an altercation between the activists of JCD and BCL on the college campus on Tuesday night. The rival student bodies

equipped with sharp weapons and sticks attacked each other at the college playground at around 12:00noon, leaving at least eight people from both sides injured, sources added.

Three of the injured--Md M Hasan, Toufiqur Islam, and Shahadat Hossain-- were admitted to Joypurhat Modern Hospital in a critical condition while the rest given first aid at a local clinic.

Being informed, police rushed to the spot, dispersed the clashing groups and brought the situation under

BCL and JCD blamed each other for the incident.

Contacted, Principal Prof Akramul Haque said the college authorities suspended all academic activities until July 31 to avert any untoward incident on the campus.

Abu Hena Mostafa Kamal, officer-in-charge of Joypurhat Sadar Police Station, said a large number police have been deployed on the campus.

No one was arrested in connection with the incident as of filing of this report at 5:00pm yesterday.

Roads and Highways Department (RHD) has undertaken the Feasibility Study of the three bridges on the Dhaka-Chittagong National Highway (N-1) i.e. Kantchpur, Meghna and Meghna-Gumti bridges under the financial assistance from Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA). The Project will prepare the preliminary engineering design for the construction of main bridge, approach roads, River Training Works (RTW), bridge and facilities (service areas, construction yards, etc.). The construction of the project components will involve massive activities which have impacts on the project affected people and environment. Considering impacts of the project, appropriate mitigation measures have been proposed by preparing Resettlement Action Plan (RAP) and Environmental Impact Assessment

The Process:

The Project is being categorized as Category "A" project in accordance with the requirements of donor's. Environment Considerations with Environmental Conservation Rules (1997) of Bangladesh (GoB) and JICA guideline requires two-stage public consultations for category "A" project. Once during the early stages of Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) field work and once when Environmental Impact Assessment report is available. First stage public consultation was held on 15 March 2012. Now the second stage public consultation (disclosure of the RAP and EMP of EIA) is being held on 1st August 2012 to let the affected people and other stakeholders know the impact mitigation policy of the project. After finalization, the RAP and EIA will be submitted to RHD and JICA and other line agencies and will be available for public review.

This is the second-stage public consultation and is scheduled to allow the public meet the project team, discuss the mitigation policy prepared on the basis of their opinion obtained during first-stage consultation on social and environmental issues and provide opportunities to participate in the

A man was killed allegedly by his elder brother following an altercation over a piece of disputed land at Santiram village in Sunderganj Upazila yesterday.
