Dispute over

Muhith says renewal within next month

Finance Minister AMA Muhith yesterday said both the government and mobile operators will withdraw their cases regarding the disputes over 2G mobile licence renewal payment to resolve the problem in the sector.

Talking to journalists after an inter-ministerial meeting at his ministry, Muhith said the licence renewal dispute would be solved within August, as all the parties concerned including the telecom regulator, tax administrator and mobile companies agreed to withdraw their

He said the operators informed him that they could not make fresh investments as licences were not in their

Licences of four mobile companies including Grameenphone, Banglalink, Robi and Citycell were supposed to be renewed for the next 15 years on April 10 last year. 
