

Blind archer breaks world record

Milon ranks 61st

Bangladeshi archer Emdadul Haque Milon will come up against Great Britain's Larry Godfrey after finishing 61st out of 64 competitors at the Men's Ranking round in the archery event of the London Olympic Games held at Lord's yesterday.

They will face-off in a winner takes all contest which will be held at the same venue at 5:30 pm

British standard time on July 30. Milon was drawn against the great British hope after managing a total score of 636 in the 72-arrow ranking round. Godfrey managed a respectable 680, to finish fourth in the overall rank.

But Godfrey's mark was still far behind South Korea's Im Dong-Hyun.

The 'legally blind' archer SEE PAGE 17 COL 5 broke his own 72-arrow

world record in the archery ranking round for the London Olympic Games with a score of 699 on Friday.

Im and his teammates Kim Bub-min and Oh Jin-hyek also broke the team world record for 72 arrows with a score of 2087.

The archery event was marred by a number of incidents before the start of play. Dozens of spectators were left disappointed as they were denied entry into the first London-based action of the Olympics. Many had thought that since the ranking round was a non-ticketed

event, they could catch a glimpse of the action of a first-come, first-served basis, similar to what is scheduled for cycling road race. But stewards were not permitted to allow access to the 50 or so fans who had gathered by the time the competition got underway.

Even at the best of times, archery is a low-key, quiet affair that requires intense concentration. As such there is often little hubbub surrounding the sport and none of the

passion that sets apart sports like football. But yesterday at the Lord's Cricket Ground, it was archery that kicked-off the

non-football events on a day when the whole of London was more fixated on the opening ceremony. It was with a mild amount of surprise then that a small corner of the ground was found to be quiet noisy. And with good reason too. Lord's, the home of cricket, had bought together two of its most famous sons.

Far to the left of the nursery stood two men who in the past had fought many battles against each other, many too in this very ground. A slightly more greying, but no less graceful Michael Atherton, once captain of England, stood chatting to another slightly greying gentleman dressed in a baggy green

cap. That man was the former Australia captain Steve Waugh.

It was almost too surreal. Two former cricket captains, standing side-by-side in an archery event at the Olympic Games. It takes quite a bit of imagination to put that together.

Atherton, now a full-fledged journalist for London Times, summed it up best in the first thing that he said to Waugh, "What in the world are you doing here?"

The answer to which, of course, is that Steve Waugh is acting as one of three athlete liaison officers with the Australian team. And true to type, it is a role he has filled with some controversy.


Waugh had apparently clashed with another liaison officer, Kieren Perkins, the swimming legend, over the use of 'sledging' in archery or other sports. Waugh had apparently claimed that there was always room for such to destabilise opponents in any game.

But yesterday, Waugh swiftly brushed off those claims saying instead that his comments were off-the-cuff, said as a joke, and taken completely out of context.

Syque Caesar really wants to meet Usain Bolt. He also wants to meet Michael Phelps and although he has already seen the great man in passing, he would like the time to properly get introduced to the swim-

mer and perhaps indulge in the commonplace Olympic hobby of badge swapping.

For now though, Syque is focused solely on Saturday where he aims to hit perfectly the gymnastic routines that he has practiced over the course of this year.

"As of right now, I'm just concentrating on my gymnastics, once I'm done I'll go and try to meet as many people as I can," he told The Daily Star on Friday.

But concentrating has not been easy. This, after all, is the Olympics.

"I've been trying to approach this competition as I would for any other competition except that I definitely have to try a lot harder mentally to not get distracted by all of the cameras, noises, and even images of the Olympic rings everywhere," admits Syque.

Life at the village too is surreal perhaps because of the buzz around it.

"There is definitely a huge Olympic spirit in the village which is nice. But I'm trying to keep the nervousness down to a minimum. My excitement level is probably higher than my level of nervousness," says Syque.

A recent bicep injury has put a dent into Syque's preparations for the Olympics and the University of Michigan gymnast admitted that it has led to some changes.

"I've had to drop still rings and pommel horse for the time being," he

says before adding quickly that he is still practicing in the other events on full difficulty. "I've been very diligent

with doing a lot of treatment on my bicep and keeping it's feeling as good as it can. As of right now, it feels great," says Syque, allaying any fears that many might have harbored. Intriguingly, Syque will

come up against his college roommate Sam Mikulak, who will be turning out for the US national team, but perhaps that will give an

altogether more homely feeling to the competition. "I've been training and competing with

and against Sam for two years already. I'll be cheering Sam on as he competes and I'm sure he'll be cheering me on as I compete, just like a typical collegiate competition,' says Syque.
