



Asks police to ensure peace on campus

The High Court yesterday issued an injunction against the ongoing agitation and strike by Buet teachers, employees and students to help the engineering institution run its academic functions smoothly.

It also directed the inspector general of police (IGP) and Dhaka Metropolitan Police commissioner to ensure that law and order was maintained on the campus of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (Buet).

Meanwhile, in a late-night development, Buet Teachers' Association called off their agitation.

The injunction came after a hearing on a writ petition filed by Eunus Ali Akond, a lawyer of the Supreme Court. He filed the petition on Sunday as public interest litigation seeking directives on the Buet authorities to resume classes within 24 hours.

"My sir [Kamaruzzaman] had converted Shushil to Islam at the camp [Al-Badr camp] at Surendra Saha's house and taken him to the Nayani Bari camp," said Monowar alias Mohan Munshi, second prosecution witness in the war crimes case against Kamaruzzaman, during his crossexamination.
