POLICE FIRING AT JU

VC calls for probe

Vice Chancellor of Jahangirnagar University Prof Anwar Hossain yesterday requested the government to open a judicial investigation into Wednesday night's police firing, which left five students injured and led to widespread violence on the campus.

Speaking at a press conference at the senate hall, he also termed the violence and vandalism on the campus by students as "terrorist activities" and regretted the incident.

Immediately after the police firing at Mir Mosharraf Hossain Hall, protesting students vandalised the administrative building, the university main gate, and the residences of the provost, proctor and former VC Prof ShariffEnamul Kabir.

On Wednesday night, police went to the dormitory to arrest a third year student named Nahid on charge of stabbing another

student, Tahmidul Islam Likhon, who allegedly belongs to a group opposing the ex-VC. Nahid and two other students-

Ashrafuzzaman Liton and Mahbub Riazare said be loyal to Prof Shariff and have led some 10-12 youths who stabbed Likhon.

As police went to the hall to arrest Nahid, the resident students resisted them, prompting police to fire rubber bullets on them.

Prof Anwar said the policemen were not directed to arrest the student [Nahid] or open fire on them. They did not maintain due procedure during the action, he added.

Asked if he would bring any change in the administration which is predominantly loyal to the ex-VC, Prof Anwar said he would do that as per the university act if necessary.

They were elected from Jatiyatabadi Ainjibi Oikya Panel, a body of BNP led 18party alliance lawyers, in the bar council election held on July 18.

DEPORTATION US citizen seeks reasons from PM

A US citizen, who was denied entry to Bangladesh on July 23, has requested the Bangladesh prime minister to explain the reasons for the denial and to withdraw restriction on him to travel Bangladesh in future.

Thomas Christian Eskildsen, co-president of Jumma-net, a Japanese NGO working for indigenous people in Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT), made the request through a letter to

the premier, dated July 30. He was detained at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport on July 23 and deported to Bangkok the next day over allegation of "controversial activities in

CHT".

"I did not receive full explanation of the reason for my detention by the airport police and deportation to Bangkok...I ask that I be given a full explanation of the reasons for denial of my entry to Bangladesh," he

said in the letter. On January 3, Eskildsen was ordered to leave Bandarban after detention and interrogation by intelligence authorities.

Rajshahi drug store owners observe 5hr strike

Drug store owners observed a wildcat strike in Rajshahi city for five hours yesterday protesting a drive conducted by the Department of National Consumer Rights Protection (DNCRP).

A team, led by DNCRP Deputy Director Sukumar Chandra Kundu, started raiding the drug stores in the city's Laxmipur area around 11:00am.

It fined Drug Centre Tk 8,000 on charge of selling drugs of physician samples and not hanging medicine price chart.

Assisted by police, the team consist of different government officials, BSTI officials, and Consumers Association of Bangladesh General Secretary Golam Mostafa Mamun. Soon after the drive, the drug store owners of the area started

the strike and took to the streets. Later, all other owners shut down their stores for indefinite period around 12:00 noon. Later, a large number of the attendants of patients who

came to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital and other clinics in the city fell into a crisis. Following the crisis, Rajshahi city Mayor AHM
