A top policeman in court yesterday accused former state minister for home Lutfozzaman Babar of destroying evidence in connection with the August 21, 2004 grenade attack on an Awami League rally at Bangabandhu Avenue in Dhaka.

SM Mizanur Rahman, who had become acting commissioner of

Dhaka Metropolitan Police just three hours prior to the attack, was deposing before a Dhaka court yesterday.

Mizanur, now on leave prepara-



tory to retirement (LPR), told the court, "On the very day of the grenade attack, Babar hurriedly directed army experts to destroy two live grenades that had been recovered from the place of occurrence, even though I had told him [Babar] that the grenades were very essential evidence...'

One thing is clear: whoever is prime minister will be an



to run and the guy was telling me to line up straight," Bolt said early Monday. "I was like, 'Really? We're about to run and they are going to make me stand in a straight line?' There are just some weird rules

Such as not being allowed to get skipping ropes past security.

"They said I can't bring it in, and I asked, 'Why?'" Bolt recalled. "They just said, 'It is the rules.' So if I have a rubber band that I need to stretch, I can't take it in. And when I asked why, they say, 'It's just the rules.'

"It's just some weird small rules that don't make any sense to me, personally."
