War crimes witness says 60 killed in a day at Keraniganj

War crimes accused Jamaat-e-Islami leader Abdul Quader Mollah directly took part in killing of around 60 people at Ghatarchar in Keraniganj on November 25, 1971, an eyewitness told the International Crimes Tribunal-2 yesterday.

Abdul Majid Palowan, a resident of Ghatarchar and seventh prosecution witness in the war crimes case against Quader Mollah, added the Jamaat leader

held a meeting at Ghatarchar on the night before the massacre.

The 55-year-old witness said he was hiding behind a tree from where he saw Quader Mollah firing on the people at Ghatarchar School ground.

Mozaffar Ahmed Khan, the first prosecution witness in the case, also narrated the same massacre in his testimony on July 3.
