### President leaves for S Arabia

President Zillur Rahman left for a five-day visit to Saudi Arabia early hours today to attend the twoday (August 14-15) 4th Extraordinary Session of the Islamic Summit of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation in Makkah.

Saudi Arabia's King Abdullah bin Abdul-Aziz will examine the Islamic world, address the sources of discord and division, reunify the Islamic Ummah and promote Islamic solidarity.

Presidents of the member countries' will attend the summit, which will be preceded by two meetings, the first at foreign ministers' level to prepare for the summit and the second at the senior officials' level to prepare for the ministerial meeting.

# Stop going after Dr Yunus: B Chy

# 4 held with 81 fake passports in capital returned expatriates who were not STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Four members of a passport counterfeiting gang along with 81 fake passports were caught when Detective Branch (DB) of police launched a drive in the capital's Jatrabari on Saturday. The arrestees were Md Firoz Hossain, 30,

Md Rajib, 25, Md Yunus Mallik, 30, and Md Sumon, 22. Al-Beli Afifa, senior assistant commis-

sioner of DB police, said they arrested the

gang members from Dakkhinpara in Matuail around 5:30pm on Saturday. Using information from the arrestees during primary interrogation, detectives

recovered fake passports from the house of Firoz in Matuail, she said. They also recovered some torn pages of

passports that contained immigration seals and visas.

"The gang used to collect passports of

interested to go back again. To collect those, they used various techniques including cheating and theft," Afifa said. They changed the photographs of the

passports, replacing the photo of the original passport bearer with that of the person interested to go abroad illegally, she said. The gang maintained liaison with the

brokers at passport offices and supplied fake passports to job seekers, she added. A case was filed with Jatrabari Police

# Natural disasters hamper target

Says study

Achieving target of ensuring drinking water and sanitation would not be possible by 2013 due to natural disasters in the country, said a study.

To achieve the target, the government needs to ensure increase yearly coverage of access to sanitation rate from 0.75 percent to 22.10 percent. Now around 81.04 percent households have access to sanitation, it said.

The study titled "Mainstreaming of Disaster Risk

Reduction into Government's Schemes on Water and Sanitation: Gap Analysis and Way Forward" suggested adoption of geo-hazard specific risk reduction strategies. AKM Musha, country director of Concern Worldwide,

Bangladesh, presented the findings at a workshop in the capital yesterday. National Alliance for Risk Reduction and Response Initiative (NARRI) conducted the research in 13 districts.

With the Department of Public Health Engineering Chief Engineer Mohammad Nuruzzaman in the chair, Food and Disaster Management Minister Abdur Razzque, and European Union representative Oliver Brouant also spoke.

# 98pc people want amendment

Says survey STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Around 98 percent of the country's people demand amendment to the tobacco control act, said speakers at a programme yesterday.

The habit of smoking has come down in many countries due to pictorial messages displayed on packets of tobacco products like cigarettes, they said.

Consumers Association of Bangladesh (CAB) organised the programme in the capital's Dhaka Reporters Unity to disseminate the findings of a survey carried out by Quark Global Strategies, an international research organisation.

Citing the survey, they said people's opinion on prioritising public health and introducing the pictorial warnings surely prove that people remain strict towards amending the act. The survey said around 98 percent of the respondents

voted to ban sale of cigarettes to under-18 children and approximately 78 percent deem a ban on advertisement and promotion of tobacco necessary.

Around 99 percent people, 97 percent of them smokers, backed a smoking ban in public places, including workplaces and restaurants, it said.

The High Court (HC) yesterday asked the government to explain in two weeks why filling up of Moidara river in Rampal upazila of Bagerhat near the Sundarbans for setting up a coal-fired power plant should not be declared illegal.

The court came up with the rule following a writ petition filed last week by Save the Sundarbans, an environmentalist organisation, saying that the government authorities concerned have been filing earth in the Moidara river to set up the power plant violating the environment laws.

Earlier on March 22, the HC in response to another writ petition issued a rule upon the government to explain why it should not be directed not to set up the proposed 1,300 Megawatt coal-fired power plant at Sapmari-Katakhali Mouja of Rampal.

Barrister Zakir Hossain, a lawyer for the petitioner Save the Sundarbans, said the authorities have been filing earth in Moidara river violating the environment laws, although the earlier HCrule is still pending.

An HC bench of Justice Hasan Foez Siddique and Justice ABM Altaf Hossain issued yesterday's rule.
