diplomatic career, besides being the consul general of Bangladesh in Dubai, he served in Bangladesh embassies in Manama, Moscow and Bangkok in various capacities. Hye graduated from

Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology and is married with two sons.

TRIAL OF 46 OPPOSITION LEADERS

HC starts hearing govt petition against stay order

The High Court yesterday started hearing a government petition seeking vacation of the court's earlier order that had stayed the operations of a Dhaka court dealing with an arson case against 46 opposition leaders.

During the hearing, Attorney General Mahbubey Alam said the government had constituted the Speedy Trial Court-5 of Dhaka as per provisions of relevant law, which had framed charges against the 46 accused.

The Chief Metropolitan Magistrate (CMM) has given judicial power to Magistrate Harun-or Rashid to conduct the speedy trial court in due process of law, he said.

Following a writ petition, the HC stayed for eight weeks all the functions of Speedy Trial Court-5 on August 6. It also issued a rule upon the authorities concerned to explain why the CMM Court's decision to give judicial powers to the Trial Court to conduct the case should not be declared illegal. Ahsanul Karim, a counsel for the writ petitioner, opposed

the government petition, saying the CMM had no power to give judicial power to any magistrate for dealing with the case, and it was illegal to give power to Magistrate Harun-or Rashid to conduct the Speedy Trial Court-5.

The HC bench of Justice Naima Haider and Justice Muhammad Khurshid Alam Sarkar adjourned the hearing till today.

The 46 opposition leaders including BNP Acting Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir were charged with torching a bus near the Prime Minister's Office on April 29.

CTG EID MARKETS

Sellers disappointed over fewer shoppers

People of low income group in Chittagong have been crowding different markets on the city's footpaths to complete their Eid shopping but sellers are frustrated as the number of buyers has been less than what they anticipated.

Hundreds of people from different parts of the city continue to flock to the five footpath market hubs at New Market, Agrabad, Chittagong Export Processing Zone (CEPZ), No. 2 gate intersection and Bahadderhat where more than 4,000 shop owners display their collections.

Shop owners of different footpath markets as well as those of more elegant markets are discouraged by the dearth of shoppers in this Eid season.

Md Alam, a seasonal shop owner at New Market footpath, who sells panjabis, shirts, pants and T-shirts, expressed his disap-

pointment over the season's sales. "Every year the market becomes full with the start of Ramadan but this year the scenario is completely different. Ramadan is about to end but most of my items remain

unsold," said Alam.

Other shop owners echo Alam's sentiments but most of them are optimistic that sales would boom in the last five days of Ramadan.

The footpath market of CEPZ area, with more than 800 shops, has seen highest number of shoppers compared to the other footpath markets.

Most of the shoppers at the CEPZ market are garment workers and people of low income group who have small budgets for their Eid shopping.

Rubel Das, a worker in a garment factory, was seen bargaining with a shop owner at CEPZ market over the price of a panjabi.

"This year my budget is Tk 3,000 and within this I have to shop for myself and my two brothers," Rubel said.

But the prices of clothes are higher than last year's, he added. "Footpath markets are ideal for us

because other markets have very high prices suitable for wealthier customers, Rubel said. Abul Bashar, vice president of Chittagong

usually there are about 3,000 makeshift shops on the five footpath markets of the city. Chittagong Metropolitan Hawkers

Metropolitan Hawkers Association, said

Association is an umbrella organisation of all the hawkers' organisations of the city.

Ahead of Eid about 1,000 more shops have been set up, Bashar said.

Like other shop owners he too expects that in the last five days of Ramadan the shops would be swarming with Eid shoppers.

Make ICT permanent

Six organisations urge

Six organisations advocating for war crimes trial yesterday called for enacting a law to give the International Crimes Tribunal a permanent existence with administrative and financial autonomy and sought prime minister's intervention to this end.

"We demand a law to give the tribunals a permanent shape so that the tribunals can operate even after change of any government," said Shahriar Kabir, acting president of Ekatturer Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee.

At a joint press conference at Dhaka Reporters Unity, the organisations also urged the prime minister to ensure necessary manpower and other supports to the tribunal for its smooth functioning.

Expressing disappointment at the slow pace of the trial, they said timely completion of the trial would not be possible with the existing manpower and logistics.

"The trial procedure is going at snail pace. If it continues this way, we fear that trial of 10 war crimes suspects would not be completed by December 2013," said Shahriar Kabir.

There will be a serious national catastrophe if the trial is not completed by 2013, he said.

About shortage of manpower, Shahriar Kabir said that although 150 officials and employees were required in general division of the tribunal, it had only 15. Moreover, most of the 15 lawyers appointed so far do

not come to tribunal regularly as the salary and remuneration are insufficient. Shahriar Kabir blamed law and home ministries for the

slow pace saying the ministries failed to understand the challenges of the trial and considered it a criminal case. He also expressed worries about the security of the

entire tribunal. "Nobody will notice if anyone plants anything dangerous at the tribunal compound...there is no security of the judges, lawyers, and investigating agency. The witnesses

have no protection," he said. The other organisers of the news conference include Antorjatik Oporadh Tribunal Shoyaok Mancha, Sector Commanders Forum '71, Bangladesh Mahila Parishad, Projonmo '71, and Udichi.


