



AL to take tough stance on 'anarchy'

The ruling Awami League will adopt a tough position against the BNP-led opposition if it carries out destructive activities in the name of movements to press the demand for the restoration of the caretaker government, party insiders have said.

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia on June 11 threatened to launch tougher agitations like hartal, blockade and mass sit-in after Eid-ul-Fitr if the government did not fulfil the demand.

BNP now mulls go-slow policy

Despite making repeated threats to go for a tougher agitation after the Eid-ul-Fitr, the main opposition BNP now plans to build up the movement gradually to restore the caretaker government system in the constitution.

The high command believes this strategy would help them create an anti-government sentiment among the people ahead of the next general elections.

They think it would be too early to go for an oustgovernment movement after the Eid as the tenure of the present government will expire in January 2014.

Party insiders said a meeting of the secretary generals of the BNP-led 18-party alliance will be held soon to discuss the agitation programme, which would be finalised by the national standing committee of BNP.

State-run steamer service in bad shape

The BIWTC passenger service is in a precarious state to tackle the Eid exodus from the major cities as some of its old vessels remain inoperative for years due to poor repair and maintenance.

The state-run company has six passenger steamers in its fleet with the capacity of carrying 4,122 passengers in a single trip, said sources in Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Corporation (BIWTC).

Of them, MV Shela has been undergoing repair for more than one year, while MV Sonargaon has been out of service since last winter. This has cut down the BIWTC's passenger capacity to 2,810.

Talking to The Daily Star, BIWTC Chairman Mojibor Rahman said MV Shela will be fit and start carrying Eid holidaymakers this week.



Mother, daughter brutally killed

Bodies found at N'ganj flat

Police recovered the bodies of a mother and her daughter from their flat in Paikpara residential area in Narayanganj city yesterday.

The dead were identified as Maria Akhter, 46, wife of an expatriate, and her daughter Sadia Akhter, 12, a class six student of Ideal Girls High School in the city.

Police also recovered a blood stained lungi and a pair of unused hand gloves from the crime scene. Law enforcers suspect that they were murdered two days earlier as the bodies had decomposed.

However, police were yet to ascertain the motive for the double murder.

Narayanganj Sadar Model Police Station Officer-in-Charge Manzur Quader said Maria had been beheaded and her legs tied. A knife was found beside the body of Sadia.

Police primarily assumed that it was unlikely to be a case of robbery or mugging. The OC said the killers might

have been acquaintances of the victims. He said the killers might be identified from the call list of Maria's mobile phone and fingerprints on the recov-
