DU BLACK DAY Trial of perpetrators demanded

The Dhaka University authorities yesterday observed the university Black Day marking the 2007 army assault on the students.

On the occasion, students, teachers and officials wore black ribbons, and classes were suspended till 1:00pm. They also held a discussion at TSC.

The DU Black Day is observed on August 23, but this year the authorities shifted it to August 28 (yesterday) due to Eid vacation. Addressing the programme as chief guest, Vice Chancellor Prof AAMS Arefin Siddique urged the government to take necessary steps against the culprits to stop recurrence of such incidents. No-one will dare to do the same thing in the future if the culprits are tried, he said.

DU Pro-VC (Administration) Prof Shahid Akhtar Hussain and Pro-VC (Education) Prof Nasreen Ahmad also addressed the programme.

On August 20, 2007, army men assaulted some students on the university central playground during a football match. Immediately after the incident, thousands of DU students took to streets and demanded withdrawal of an army camp from the university's gymnasium and an apology from the troops.

Over the next two days, law enforces and students clashed on the campus, which left more than 250 people wounded, mostly students. The then army-backed caretaker government later arrested four DU teachers and several students.

On December 11, 2011, a parliamentary body recommended that former chief adviser Fakhruddin Ahmed, exhome adviser MA Matin, former army chief Moeen U Ahmed, ex-DGFI officers ATM Amin and Fazlul Bari should be brought to justice for their role.

It also blamed the then DGFI official Shamsul Alam Khan, former police chief Nur Mohammad and Maj (retd) Quamrul and DU Assistant Proctor Nazmul Ahsan Kolimullah for the incident.

Two pro-AL, one pro-BNP teachers elected JU deans

Two pro-Awami League and one BNP backed professors won the Jahangirnagar University deans' election yesterday.

AL backed Prof Abul Hossain was elected dean to the mathematical and physical sciences faculty and Prof Abul Khayer to the biological sciences faculty. They belonged to "Muktijuddher Pokkher Shakti" panel.

From the opposing panel, "Samonnito Shikkhak Parishad", pro-BNP Prof Sayed Kamrul Ahsan was elected dean to the arts and humanities faculty.

A total of 446 teachers cast their vote at the Teacher's Club to elect deans to four out of six faculties of the university yesterday.

The result of the election to the social science faculty was suspended, as two rival candidates secured the same number of votes--50. Prof Sajed Asraf Karim and Prof Amir Hossen contested in the election.

Election Commissioner and JU Registrar Abu Bakar Siddique said the authorities will announce the result soon.

The elected deans to two remaining faculties--law and justice and business studies--are still to finish their current term.

Railway West Zone land records show discrepancy

In a special audit, the Railway Audit Directorate (RAD) has found discrepancies in the land records of the West Zone of Bangladesh Railway.

The audit report said the inconsistencies proved that the BR did not keep its land records in a proper register book.

A 2008 inventory at the office of Chief Estate Officer showed the total land of the railway West Zone at 38,971 acres. One year later, the amount of land was reduced by 795 acres to 38,176 acres in the document.

The railway officials provided the accounts of land on the basis of assumptions, and it can be considered as an irregularity, said M Matiar Rahman, director general of RAD, who

signed the audit report on November 2 The Daily Star has recently obtained

the document. Inconsistencies were also found in the

records of the landed property of Pakshey Division of West Zone. The land under the Division was shown to be 26,409 acres in 2003, while it

was increased by 467 acres to 26,876 acres

in a fresh document in 2010. A 2003 record showed that 15,181 acres of land was in use for railway operation under Pakshey Division. In 2010, the amount of the land was found to be 9,022 acres, 6,159 acres less than the 2003 fig-

The RAD discovered the inconsistencies while carrying out a special audit of the West Zone land for 2007-08 and 2009-10 financial years.

Ctg port in clutch of 'mafia group'

Awami League Chittagong city unit President ABM Mohiuddin Chowdhury yesterday called for raising a movement to save the Chittagong Port from the clutch of a "mafia group".

Addressing a press conference at Chittagong Press Club, he alleged that several terms and conditions have been changed or relaxed in the original tender documents regarding appointment of private operators in the in New Mooring Container Terminal (NCT) in the port in favour of a particular local firm.

The former mayor of Chittagong City Corporation demanded the Chittagong Port Authority (CPA) to postpone the last date of submitting tender document regarding appointment of the operators scheduled on August 30.

Meanwhile, Central Procurement Technical Unit (CPTU) yesterday issued a notice to the secretary of shipping ministry, CPA chairman and two others to attend a hearing on the tender for the appointment.

The hearing would be held at the conference room of CPTU in Dhaka on September 2, according to the notice signed by M Shamsul Huq, chairperson of Review Panel-3 of CPTU.

Earlier, Jose Manuel M De

Jesus, vice-president of International Container Terminal Services, a Manilabased container operator firm which was selected as prequalified firm by an evaluation committee on February 12 in 2009 to operate the NCT, submitted a review appeal alleging that there were some irregularities in the tendering process.

Contacted, CPA Secretary Syed Farhad Uddin Ahmed said the CPA cannot change or postpone the date for submission of tender as it was fixed by the ministry.

AL leaders Iftekher Saimul Chowdhury, and MA Rashid, among others, were present at the conference.

On Monday, a mother took her own life after killing her daughters by taking poison following a feud over extramarital affair of her husband.

Dhaka South City Corporation (DSCC) has been asked to deploy additional manpower for better traffic management in the underconstruction Gulistan-Jatrabari flyover area of the capital.

The decision came at a meeting on the flyover construction held in the conference room of Local Government Division on Monday.

The current poor condition of the road, illegal parking and lack of traffic management cause heavy traffic congestion in the area.

"If the corporation fails to mange traffic in the area then we will deploy other forces like police, Rab or army personnel to ensure smooth traffic movement," Local Government Division Secretary Abu Alam Mohammad Shahid Khan said at the meeting.

organisations concerned to complete the underground and overhead utility lines relocation in the construction site of the flyover, also known as the Mayor Mohammad Hanif Flyover, with a view to complete the flyover by March 26 next year.

"We are hopeful that the work of the flyover will be completed by mid March of next year and the prime minister will be able to inaugurate the flyover on March 26," said State Minister for LGRD and Cooperatives Jahangir Kabir Nanak at the meeting.

Belhasa Accom and Associates Ltd is implementing the project at a cost of about Tk 2,108 crore on Build- Own-Operate-Transfer (BOOT) basis, first of its kind in Bangladesh.

The flyover which was initially 7km long will now be 10km from Palashi to Jatrabari.
