Non-govt teachers' registration exam from August 31

The 8th Non-government Teachers' Registration Examination-2012, a pre-qualifying examination to appoint teachers in schools, colleges, madrasas, and technical institutes, will be held in two phases from August 31.

The test for school level will be held on August 31 from 8:30am to 12:30pm while the college level test will be held on September 1 from 9:00am to 1:00pm, said education ministry's handout.

Candidates of both the categories will have to take an hour-long exam on compulsory course in MCQ method and then a three-hour long exam for the optional course, it said.

UNREST AT BUET

Teachers seek govt intervention

Teachers of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (Buet) yesterday said government's intervention was required to break the deadlock at the institution.

"The government should come forward to save the reputed institution through removing the incumbent vice chancellor and his deputy," said Prof Ashraful Islam, a teachers' leader.

No classes have been held at Buet since it reopened on Saturday after a 44-day closure. Student presence was also thin yesterday.

The Buet authorities have called an academic council meeting on Monday to decide on taking admission test as soon as

possible this year.

Seeking anonymity, a teacher, however, told The Daily Star that most of the teachers would not attend the meeting under the current administration. Buet Teachers Association launched agitation on April 7, bringing 16 allegations against VC Prof SM Nazrul Islam and Pro-VC Prof M Habibur Rahman.

They have been refrained from the protest since July 31 after the High Court directed them not to stage any demonstration for the interest of smooth academic activities.

The teachers, however, have been individually continuing token strikes wearing black T-shirts reading "Save Buet, Remove the VC and Pro-VC" since reopening of the university.

CATTLE MARKET

DSCC gets highest offer at Tk 4.38cr

The Dhaka South City Corporation (DSCC) yesterday opened the tender of 10 makeshift cattle markets in the city and received the highest offer of around Tk 4.38 crore for Armanitola cattle market in Nayabazar.

It was Tk 3.27 crore last year for the cattle market, which is the largest makeshift market in the city.

The DSCC this year is setting up 10 makeshift cattle markets while Dhaka North City Corporation is yet to float any tender.

Dhaka City Corporation last year set up 16 makeshift cattle markets across the city and earned Tk 8.01 crore.

The chief estate officer of DSCC Tajul Islam Proddhan opened the tender at Nagar Bhaban in the presence of the bidders.

WAR CRIMES TRIAL

Contempt of court charges sought against Matia

Defence counsels of war crimes accused Muhammad Kamaruzzaman yesterday filed a petition asking ICT-2 to bring contempt of court charges against Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury for allegedly making statements disrespecting the tribunal.

The International Crimes Tribunal (ICT)-2 fixed September 5 to hear the petition.

Prosecutor Rana Dasgupta told the tribunal that politicians might say many things in the political arena and the defence should not bring everything before the tribunal "to delay the trial proceedings."

Quoting the petition, defence counsel Tajul Islam said ruling Awami League presidium member Matia made the statements during a visit to her Sherpur constituency on August 7 and 8.

Quoting an August 8 Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha report published in Daily Naya Diganta, Tajul said Matia, at Nalitabari on August 7, said, "Those giving evidence in favour of war criminals would be identified and a resistance movement would be waged against them in the locality."

Quoting a Barta24.net report, Tajul said Matia, on August 8, said, "No witness giving evidence in favour of Kamaruzzaman would be able to return home as that person would be beaten up by the public."

Such statements would infuse fear in defence witnesses and they would not appear before the tribunal, a clear obstruction to justice delivery, he said.
