HALLMARK LOAN SCAM

17 Sonali Bank officials suspended

Sonali Bank Ltd yesterday suspended 17 of its officials for their alleged involvement in a Tk 3,500-crore loan scam, officials said.

The officials have been held responsible for unethical disbursement of loans to the textile company Hallmark Group and some other firms, according to an investigation by the central bank.

The state-owned bank has also written to the finance ministry to take action against three top officials.

Bangladesh Bank on August 26 directed Sonali Bank to suspend by Thursday 31 of its officials, including two deputy managing directors, on charges of their involvement in the anomalies.

The suspended officials are senior officers of Ruposhi Bangla Hotel branch Ujjal Kishore Dhar, Tushar Kanti Dhar, Jasmine Nahar, Mihir Chandra Mazumder, junior officer Wakiluddin Ahmed and officer Saidur Rahman, deputy general manager of international trade department Sheikh Altaf Hossain, assistant general managers Shafiz Uddin Ahmed and Ijaz Ahmed, senior executive officer Mukhlesur Rahman, executive officer Sohrab Hossain, assistant general managers of the general manager's office **SEE PAGE 19 COL 3**

Jatiya Party Chairman HM Ershad says he wants to be the prime minister through the next parliamentary elections. In an exclusive inter-

view with The Daily Star after his recent India visit, the key partner in the Awami League-led ruling coalition explained why he believes he could be the next head of government.

If the AL, BNP and JP take part in the next election, none of the parties would get a single majority to form a government, he said, adding that if the JP got more than 60 seats he would become the deciding factor and might become the premier, as neither the AL nor the BNP would be able to reach a consensus on forming a government.

WB still silent

Co-financier ADB extends time for loan, Jica not yet

Since hope is still there regarding the World Bank's taking the lead in the financing of the Padma bridge project, the Asian Development Bank has extended its loan effectuation deadline by another month.

Japan International Cooperation Agency (Jica), another partner of the project's finance, is expected to extend its loan effectuation deadline as well.

The loan effectuation date of the ADB and Jica was expected to expire today. Earlier they were extended, for the fourth time, on July 31.

A high official of the Economic Relations Division (ERD) said the department had written to the ADB and Jica requesting an extension of the deadline.

The ADB last night in a letter told the ERD that it had extended the deadline by a month. Jica is yet to respond. It may respond positively today, ERD officials have claimed.
