The students have to pay fee Tk 560 for the admission test.


VoIP equipment seized

Criticising the World Bank for scrapping its loan deal on Padma Bridge construction, Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury yesterday called upon the global lending agency not to insult the people of Bangladesh. "Don't insult the people of

Bangladesh...come up with funding for the Padma Bridge," she told a discussion at the National Press Club expressing her anger at the WB dilemma over reviving its loan deal.

Matia said construction of the Padma Bridge is their (AL govt) election pledge and the government would implement the project at any cost.

Bangladesh Krishak League arranged the event marking the 37th death anniversary of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

The minister said the present government could successfully run the country over the last three and half years. Matia urged the opposition to come up with

the constructive criticism of the government on its activities. "The opposition is our friend...we want their constructive criticism." Despite a rise in oil prices in the interna-

tional market, the government could keep the oil price at tolerable level, Matia said adding, "We could also control the price hike of essentials."

two directors Gofranul Huq and Sayed-ur Rahman. Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) filed the petitions on August 13 challenging the legality of the lower court order that had

granted bail to the five top officials. On July 31, the ACC sued 22 officials of Destiny Group for laundering Tk 3,285.26 crore by cheating investors.

Two women shot in capital

A woman and her niece were shot and injured by unknown criminals following a feud allegedly over drug trading in the capital's Uttarkhan area yesterday.

Bullet-hit Shamsunnahar Champa, 38, and her niece Jui Akhter, 20, were rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH).

Champa sustained wounds in her abdomen, leg, finger and right hand while Jui in her right leg.

Md Yunus Ali, officer-in-charge at Uttarkhan Police Station, said two armed criminals banged on the door of Champa's Noapara residence around 7:30am.

As Champa opened the door, the criminals shot her and Jui, he said adding that they were investigating the matter.

Champa told journalists at DMCH that associates of Chunni, a drug trader in Khilgaon area, were involved in the incident.

According to Champa, she got involved in drug trading through Chunni's persuasion about six years back when she lived at Ohab Colony of Basabo area. But, later she left the
