The scam-hit bank backs out of financing Biman to buy Boeing

Sonali Bank has shelved a decision to take part in a joint financing scheme against Biman's purchase of two new aircraft from the US plane-maker Boeing on grounds of a cash crunch.

The state-owned bank, in a letter to the finance ministry, has said in present conditions it would be unable to pay the promised \$10 million (Tk 81.9 crore) by taking part in the syndicated financing of \$80 million for Biman Bangladesh Airlines.
