

### Special drive on to nab Jamaatul Arakan activists

Law enforcers have been conducting special drives for the last one week to bust a militant outfit that sprang up recently in the country's southeastern hilly terrain.

The hitherto unknown group, who identified themselves as Jamaatul Arakan, is believed to be an offshoot of the now defunct and banned militant outfit -- Jamaatul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB).

The name of Jamaatul Arakan surfaced after police arrested four of its members from a hideout in Cox's Bazar district last Saturday.


