Nepal is yet to propose a date for the 18th summit of South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (Saarc) while it is to be the chair of Saarc after the

Maldives that hosted the 17th summit in November last year.

During the summit in Maldives, Nepal had unofficially proposed hosting the 18th summit before May 2013. But the Himalayan nation could not advance for it, mainly because of its internal political crisis.

2 killed in Rab 'crossfire'

House help killed him for money

A male servant had killed businessman Fazlul Haque at his Gulshan house on July 29, detectives claimed yesterday.

"House help Sabuj has admitted that he got in Fazlul's room on the second floor to steal money. He stabbed Fazlul in the throat with a knife when the house owner had sensed Sabuj's presence in the room," said Monirul Islam, deputy commissioner (DC) of the Detective Branch (south) of Police, at a press briefing in the Media Centre of Dhaka Metropolitan Police.

Md Sabuj, 20, was arrested on the day of the incident with seven other house helps. He was produced before the media yesterday but the journalists were not allowed to ask him anything.
