Sonali to sue culprits No middlemen

Top business body demands punishment to scamsters

The finance ministry yesterday asked the Sonali Bank to file criminal cases against the officials of the bank and Hall-Mark Group involved in the recent loan scam.

The bank and financial institutions division of the ministry in a letter directed the bank's management to take "departmental and legal action" against the top suspects in the swindle, including the bank's former managing director Humayun Kabir.

Meanwhile, the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry has demanded the immediate arrest of Hall-Mark Managing Director Tanvir Mahmud and the Sonali Bank officials involved in the fraud.

Dhaka roots for state-arranged process; Malaysian minister arrives tomorrow

Bangladesh will propose state arrangements for recruitment of workers by Malaysia as a high-level delegation from that country arrives in Dhaka tomorrow to finalise a deal. A draft memorandum of understand-

ing (MoU) now getting final touches will also seek all financial transactions of the jobseekers through banks and online registration of them, officials said.

The draft will be discussed with the 10member delegation led by Malaysian Human Resources Minister Datuk Seri Dr S Subramaniam during its three-day visit.

The Bureau of Manpower Employment

and Training (BMET), Dhaka's regulatory authority for overseas labour affairs, will manage the entire recruitment process aimed at checking malpractices rampant in private recruitment process.

"Our goal is eliminating involvement of all sorts of middlemen. Bangladesh government will directly deal with the Malaysian government or employers regarding labour recruitment," Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment Secretary Zafar Ahmed Khan told The Daily Star.

Subramaniam is scheduled to call on Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and expatriates' welfare minister Khandker Mosharraf

The ex-Jamaat ameer had assisted the Pakistan occupation army by forming auxiliary forces like Shanti Committee, Razakar, Al-Badar, Al-Shams, some of which were secret killing squads. He also had handed over women of different ages to Pakistani camps and bunkers.

14kg gold seized


Police yesterday arrested one of the members of a smugglers' ring at Shahjalal International Airport while he was bringing in 13.6 kilograms of gold worth around Tk 7 crore from Dubai.

Detained Monowarul Huq, 46, disclosed the name of a field officer of National Security Intelligence (NSI), and said that the smugglers' gang had a strong network involving many government officials deployed at the airport.

Sources at the NSI and airport said NSI Field Officer Abdul Aziz was withdrawn yesterday from his duty at the airport.
