"There is no chance to hold the Summer Championships before the election of the Bangladesh Athletics Federation as the all affiliated bodies have been asked to submit their names of representatives by September 22. After the completion of the voters' list, the National Sports Council will declare an election schedule," said BAF acting general secretary Manzor
