RMG workers go berserk

Clash with cops in N'ganj, torch police van, block highways for several hours

At least 50 people including five policemen and two journalists were injured in clashes with ready-made garment workers in Siddhirganj of Narayanganj yesterday centring a rumour that a worker was killed the previous night by muggers.

The angry workers also torched a police pick-up van, four motorcycles and a police box as they were chased by law enforcers. The sporadic clashes from noon to 2:30pm halted vehicular movements on Dhaka-Chittagong and Dhaka-Sylhet highways causing huge tailbacks. During the clashes, police fired over 100 rubber bullets

and teargas canisters to disperse the RMG workers. No one was arrested.

PRICE SOARING Govt relaxes rules for egg import

The government yesterday relaxed a condition for importing eggs of chicken, duck and poultry birds, hatching eggs and oneday-old chicks in a bid to check their soaring prices in the local market.

From now on, the importers will not need to take prior permission from the commerce ministry for importing those, according to a statement of the ministry.

US pulls embassy staff from Tunisia, Sudan

Washington ordered all non-essential staff to leave Tunisia and Sudan after its embassies were stormed by Muslims protesting an anti-Islam movie and as al-Qaeda called for more attacks on US targets.

US officials have already deployed counter-terrorism Marine units to Libya and Yemen and stationed two destroyers off the North African coast.

More than 1,000 passengers of Biman Bangladesh Airlines endured untold sufferings at Dhaka and Chittagong airports for several hours yesterday due to a flight schedule disaster of the national flag carrier.

Aggrieved passengers even vandalised a Biman counter at Shah Amanat International Airport in Chittagong

around 5:30pm after Biman delayed its flight to Abu Dhabi. The flight was initially scheduled for 11:00am but Biman officials kept on delaying the flight. They did not even provide the passengers with lunch.

In Dhaka yesterday, Biman cancelled three scheduled flights--to London, Abu Dhabi and Sylhet--due to shortage of aircraft, according to the Biman Control Room.

The disarray was due to a leased Boeing 747, which can carry 505 passengers, leaving Biman's service on September 12. The owning company of the plane pulled the aircraft out of Biman's service, without telling Biman, eight days before the lease was to end.

WAR CRIMES TRIAL

Elderly witness narrates carnage at Rangunia

Arunangshu Bimol Chowdhury took refuge in another village when he heard the Pakistani army was heading to his area. A few hours later he returned home to find eight of his relatives, including three brothers and two sistersin-law, dead.

Arunangshu, a local doctor of Ranighat village in Rangunia, Chittagong, was testifying before International Crimes Tribunal-1 yesterday in the war crimes case against Salahuddin Quader Chowdhury. The prosecution witness, who is about 80 in his 35-

minute deposition gave a brief experience of the Liberation War but mentioned nothing about the war crimes accused.

On that day, chairman of Rajanagar, Kaykobad Chowdhury, advised him to leave Jagotmollopara with his family saying there would be an attack by the Pakistan army.

He along with his family members moved to Binajuri which is two miles away from Jagotmollopara village.
