Ranjit Das' solo exhibition at Bengal art Lounge

Ranjit Das is celebrated for his unique style and fascinating themes. He is one of the most versatile Bangladeshi painters, equally adept in portraits, landscapes, visual rendering of socio-political and economic issues and other subjects. His painting methods, particularly the use of colours, have a profound influence on contemporary Bangladeshi art. Das' solo painting exhibition, titled "REM" (Rapid Eye Move-

ment), is now on at Bengal Art Lounge in Gulshan, Dhaka. At the exhibition, his figurative works have a touch of realism but also a bit of a distorted look. The artist invests much time in drawing human figures, visages and various parts of the form. Das said, "I like both abstraction and semi-abstraction. But I feel that within abstraction alone, I cannot convey my message

tion. I am constantly looking for new themes." At the current exhibition, Das has gone through various phases of experimentation -- in realism, semi-realism, expressionism and abstract expressionism. Scribbles, arrows, broken lines, loops as well as curls, squares, oval and other forms are recurring features in his works. Horses, crows, dogs, goats, herons, swans, peacocks and more have emerged on the canvas along with

human figures, broad lines and diverse complex forms.



A noticeable feature of the paintings is the intimate relationship between the figures and abstract forms. Das' signature style is distinguished by concentration on a particular limb or fraction of the human form. He builds up layers of texture (most of the time, patchy). Straight line (horizontal or vertical) across his canvas is also a personal trademark.

At the exhibition, his "Existence and Life -3" beautifully articulates two teenage girls' dreams and hopes. Tiny forms, scribbles, arrows and broken lines enrich the painting. Another painting, "Rhythm and Distortion-6", shows three shouting faces and the canvas is surrounded by lines and blurred forms. The work indicates suffering and frustration.

The painter has gone through many books and art journals, done many sketches, studied master painters like Georges Braque, Matisse, Picasso, KG Subramanyan, MF Hussain, Sunil Das and Tyeb Mehta etc. The painter remarks, "The European Renaissance masters, like Leonardo Da Vinci, Raphael and Titian have inspired me a lot. I also have great fondness for English painter William Turner, who is considered to be 'a painter of light'. The light and silhouette in Goya's works always

Depression, conflict and unstable emotional state are often highlighted in his paintings. Das tries to provide a psychological narrative. He wants to produce paintings that not only describe how we look physically but also capture mental, emotional and spiritual states. According to him, "Connections between art and the functions of the mind are the ways in which artists express their own thoughts, feelings, and anguish. Paul Cézanne, Vincent Van Gogh, Jackson Pollock, Mark Rothko, Edvard Munch and Bernard Buffet openly stated

that their art reflected their depression.'

Media is very important in Das' mode of expression. He likes to experiment with different mediums. His works are mostly drawing-based and he seemingly enjoys drawing in black, white, grey and red. In recent years, he has worked more in acrylic. The medium also assists him to create a sense of quietness and ecstasy of freedom. The painter feels comfortable working on a large canvas, as his themes and compositions demand space.

The exhibition will continue till September 28.

Honouring Tareque Masud Runway DVD launch in Dhaka

After much anticipation, the DVD of Tareque Masud's last film "Runway" was launched on September 15 at a press meet jointly organised by Laser Vision Ltd and the Tareque Masud Memorial Trust (TMMT). In addition to the film, special DVD bonuses include a 30minute documentary on the 2010-2011 countrywide release of the film as spearheaded by Tareque Masud, a short behind-the-scenes slideshow presentation, and the film's trailer.

Present on this occasion were "Runway" producer and TMMT chairperson Catherine Masud, along with "Runway" actors -- Fazlul Haque, Rabeya Akter Moni, Jayanto Chattopadhyay and Ali Ahsan.

Chairman of Laser Vision AKM, Arifur Rahman, and managing director of the company, Mazharul Islam, were also present at the ceremony.

In his speech, Arifur Rahman said, "Laser Vision started its journey with 'Matir Moina' DVD, and we have always tried to maintain a high standard. Tareque Masud was like a brother to us, and we are trying to honour his memory in whatever way we can."

from a theatre background and had never acted for the big screen. Tareque bhai was my teacher, and guided me in bringing credibility to my performance.'

In response to a question from the press about the possibility of a mainstream cinema hall release for the film in Dhaka, Catherine Masud explained that international standard digital projection systems had yet to be installed in many of the commercial halls in the country, due to prohibitive taxation and a misguided national film policy.

Catherine Masud announced at the press briefing that a special collectors' edition of the DVD would be released, featuring a documentary film on the making of "Runway", with exclusive interviews of the cast and crew. The documentary will be dedicated to the memory of four "Runway" crew members -- Tareque Masud, Mishuk Munier, Mostafizur Rahman and Motahar Hossain Wasim. They were killed in a tragic road accident on August 13, 2011. She also added that next on the anvil of the Trust is to release the DVD of Tareque Masud's first film "Adam Surat", a documentary on the life and art of the noted painter S.M.




