Brazil has chosen an armadillo as the mascot for the 2014 World Cup, football's world governing body FIFA has revealed, although the cartoon creature has yet to be named.

"I'm delighted to welcome such an important member to the 2014 team,' said legendary Brazil striker Ronaldo, who is now on the local organising committee for the competition.

"The mascot will play a key ambassadorial role in the next two years. I'm sure he will inspire many young football fans in Brazil and all over the world with the great passion which he has for the sport and for his country."

The three-banded armadillo, which is indigenous to Brazil and known as the "tatu-bola", is an endangered species. Its cartoon likeness wears a white "Brazil 2014" t-shirt and green shorts and has its own official song.

FIFA said in a statement on its website fifa.com that they and organisers analysed 47 different designs from six different Brazilian agencies and researched how they were received by the main target audience of children aged five to 12.

The governing body's secretary-general, Jerome Valcke, said the choice of the endangered armadillo was "very fitting", as one of the tournament's main aims was to raise awareness about the environment and ecology.

The armadillo mascot currently does not have a name but Brazilians will get a chance to vote on one of three possibilities: Amijubi, Fuleco or Zuzeco.

There were also wins for Paris St Germain, who beat Dynamo Kiev 4-1 on their return to the competition after eight years, newcomers Malaga, who beat Zenit St Petersburg 3-0 and former Champions League holders Porto who won 2-0 at Dinamo Zagreb.

Arsenal rode their luck to beat French champions Montpellier 2-1 away after conceding an early penalty.

PSG, outside contenders for the title after spending more than 200 million euros (\$261.11 million) on players since being taken over by Qatari investors a year ago, played superbly and were the biggest scorers on the night, thumping Kiev in Group A.

PSG striker Zlatan Ibrahimovic, who opened the scoring | having slid to the ground on his with a first-half penalty, became the first player to score in the Champions League for six different clubs having also netted for Ajax Amsterdam, Juventus, Inter Milan, Barcelona and AC Milan.

It was a dream start to the campaign for PSG with Thiago Silva netting on his debut, Alex making it 3-0 and Javier Pastore wrapping up the victory with a fourth in stoppage time. Malaga, playing in the competition for the first time, put

their financial worries to one side with a 3-0 home win over Zenit St Petersburg in Group C with two goals from midfielder Isco and one from forward Javier Saviola.

Ibrahimovic's early penalty set PSG on their way to the three points against the Ukrainians, with Thiago Silva, Alex and Javier Pastore also on target for the hosts and Miguel Veloso grabbing a consolation for Dynamo.

Yuri Semin's side were poor, and PSG will undoubtedly face stiffer tests if they are to

progress in Europe this season, but Ibrahimovic insisted the Ligue 1 club deserved all the credit for winning in such fashion.

"To win 4-1 looks easy but it wasn't easy," said the Swede, who was in a relaxed mood after the game, having scored his 29th goal in the competition with a sixth different club, despite not having produced his best performance, in his own eyes.

"After the game people look at it and say the opponents were not good, but I think we made them look

bad. It doesn't mean they are a bad team. "We will take this confidence for the next game. When you play in the Champions League you grow as a team and also as an individual. This is a statement to France and the rest of Europe that Paris has quality and big potential to do something important." The former Barcelona and AC Milan man

said that winning the group was not the most important thing, as long as PSG progress, but admitted that "after this result people are getting big hopes and putting us up there as one of the favourites."

One reason PSG fans were getting so excited about their team's prospects after the Dynamo game was the performance of

Thiago Silva, the Brazilian centre-back who marked his debut with a goal.

"I think today we showed our quality and showed that we have a top team," said the player who had struggled with injury since a 42-million euro (\$54.8m) move from AC Milan in July.

"It was great for me, after a month out injured, without playing, to come in and score a goal on my debut." PSG now travel to Portugal

in a fortnight to face Porto, who also won in their opening Group A game, 2-0 at Dinamo Zagreb thanks to goals from former Marseille midfielder Lucho Gonzalez and the Belgian Steven Defour.

### Allegri puts on a brave face

AC Milan coach Massimiliano Allegri tried to put a brave face on the disappointing 0-0 Champions League Group C draw with Anderlecht on Tuesday by saying at least they did not concede a goal.

Allegri's side have now gone three home games without scoring following 1-0 defeats by Sampdoria and Atalanta in Serie A.

"We haven't conceded a goal and that is a step forward," he told reporters in his usual monotone style.

"In the first half we made a lot of technical mistakes. It's not an easy phase we're going through as we're using up a lot of mental energy.

'We found more courage in the second half but we need to keep working."

Allegri is in his third campaign in charge of Milan, having surpassed expectations by leading them to the Serie A title in 2010-11 and then claiming the runnersup spot last season. This term Milan have

been significantly weakened by the departure of numerous players including strikers Zlatan Ibrahimovic and Antonio Cassano and defender Thiago Silva.
