


Ibra might buy five-star hotel

While it is true that the team effort will be key for Bangladesh to realise their ambition of qualifying for the Super Eight stage, Shakib can be the crucial difference between the teams if he comes out with his signature all-round brilliance. The Magura lad has time and again proven his big-match temperament and he is well ahead of his other teammates in terms of T20 experience.

The player himself was however looking forward to see that everybody do their job properly and was not too bothered with the fact that the spinners are not going to get the expected assistance from the pitch.

"We have to make sure that we do the right things in the middle; then nothing will be impossible for us. We must play good cricket and execute the plans to win the match and we must win the game if we want to play in the Super Eight," said Shakib adding that there is

Bangladesh's bowling strength is their left-arm spinners and New Zealand is aware of that fact, which is why they practised against left-arm spinners in the nets to make sure they do well against them.

"We played a lot of left-arm spin in the nets. We will play at least 12 overs of left-arm spin. We need to play them well. We have a few left-handers in the line-up so they can combat the left-arm spinners. But for the right-handers too it is important to combat them. We may play left-arm spin throughout the innings," said Taylor.

While the New Zealand skipper was looking forward to some success for his seamers as the nature of wickets in Sri Lanka has changed, he still believed that the spinners also have a big role in T20 cricket.

BCB to float fresh tender

The Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) has decided to float a fresh tender for its worldwide media rights after the failure of negotiations with local media conglomerate Virgo Media Limited.

The media company, which owns TV's Channel 9, was asked to raise its original bidding value, worth 6 million dollars, in order to match the offer made by Sporty Solutionz, an Indian consortium. The Indian company, which had offered a bid worth 15 million dollars last week, was declared ineligible as it had not provided a bank guarantee of 2.5 million dollar -- a key clause of the

tender. "Since Virgo Media couldn't match our proposal, the tender is no longer valid. They were given time till 18 September. We have now decided to go for a fresh tender," said BCB media committee chairman Jalal Yunus.

A total of four companies including Ten Sports and Sony had originally purchased the tender documents but Sporty Solutionz and Virgo Media Limited were the only companies who submitted their offers by the deadline.

The BCB had earlier floated the tender for TV rights for the period of November 1, 2012 to April 30, 2016 durng which time Bangladesh are scheduled to play 18 Test matches, 46 one-day internationals and five Twenty20 internationals as per the International Cricket Council's Future Tours Programme.

Entertaining draw for Bangladesh

The Bangladesh national football team had to be satisfied with a tense 1-1 draw in their first international friendly match in a year against hosts Nepal at the Dasharath Stadium in Kathmandu yesterday.

After the cancellation of the first of the two international friendly matches due to heavy rain on Tuesday, there was also concern of downpour for yesterday's game. But the rain God's stayed away and the match was held in front of some 5000 spectators in bright, sunny conditions.

Following Nepal's recent performance against the Bangladesh senior side and the Bangladesh U-22 side, Bangladesh were on the back foot against an improving Nepal, who even fielded a debutant U/14 player, Bimal Ghari Magar.

But Bangladesh got off to a sparkling start with striker Zahid Hasan Emily coming close to putting Bangladesh ahead in the very third minute of the game. The rest of the first half though, was an exercise in patience and none of the sides could press home their advantage and it was Bangladesh who took the lead late in the first-half with the only remarkable action of the half. According to sports portal, goalnepal.com, Nepal held the upper hand for most of the game but failed to find the Bangladesh net.

And Bangladesh made the hosts suffer in the 42nd minute, after Emily was fouled outside the box and winger Zahid Hossain exploited the chance with a fine free-kick.

Zahid, who was kept out of the SAFF Championship squad by Macedonian coach Nikola Ilievski, again came close to doubling the margin three minutes into the second half after beating the goalkeeper but he was SEE PAGE 17 COL 8



Kallis strangles Zimbabwe



Jacques Kallis recorded the best Twenty20 figures for his country to inspire South Africa to a convincing 10-wicket win over Zimbabwe in a Group C match at Hambantota on Thurs-

The 36-year-old all-rounder grabbed 4-15 and was well supported by Morne Morkel's 2-16 as Zimbabwe were kept down to 93-8 -- their second lowest total in all Twenty20 internationals -- after they were put into bat. Openers Richard Levi then notched 50 not out and

Hashim Amla an unbeaten 32 to knock off the low target in the 12.4 overs to cap a comfortable victory for one of the title favourites in this 12-team competition.

The defeat meant Zimbabwe becomes the first team to go out of the tournament after a one-sided match watched by

just 1,000 fans in Mahinda Rajapaksa Stadium. Levi hit six boundaries off 43 balls, while Amla hit three off his 33 deliveries.

Earlier Zimbabwe failed against a ruthless South African

pace quartet, led by Kallis and Morne Morkel.

Siddikur Rahman continued his recent sorry form at the Panasonic Open in the Japanese city of Hyogo yesterday, finishing the first round in joint 101st position with a distressingly ordinary round of two-over-par 73.

The severity of Siddikur's bad day was highlighted by the fact that leader Yuta Ikeda of Japan shot a superb round of nine-under-par 62 while five other golfers trailed him by two shots in joint-second position, indicating that conditions were near-perfect for golf at the Higashi Hirono Golf Club.

The 27-year-old Bangladesh golfer can however draw some solace from the fact that some other big names on the Asian Tour endured equally torrid rounds; Gaganjeet Bhullar of India, who won the recently concluded Yeangder Tournament Players Championship in Taipei, finished with threeover-par in joint 110th position while Thongchai Jaidee was sharing the 101st position with Siddikur.
