6 Trinamool ministers quit govt

Six federal ministers belonging to Mamata Banerjee-led Trinamool Congress party resigned from the UPA government in a split over economic reforms, reducing the coalition headed by Prime Minister Manmohan Singh to a parliamentary minority.

However, the government breathed easy as Samajwadi Party (SP) whose 21 lawmakers generally back the government from outside the coalition, vowed yesterday to keep up its support.

SP, headed by Mulayam Singh Yadav, is ruling India's biggest state of Uttar Pradesh where his son Akhilesh is chief minister.

The six Trinamool ministers -- one of cabinet rank and the others ministers of state -- met the prime minister at his official residence yesterday afternoon and handed over their resignations.

Later, they met President Pranab Mukherjee and handed over a letter from Trinamool Congress formally withdrawing its support to UPA, ending the more than three-year alliance between the two sides.

Trinamool, which has 19 lawmakers in Lok Sabha, had held the key railways portfolio at cabinet rank and five junior ministers in other ministries -- tourism, health, urban development, rural development and information and broadcasting.

ANTI-ISLAM FILM PROTESTS

19 killed in Pakistan

STAR REPORT

At least 19 people died yesterday as violent protests erupted on the streets of Pakistan's main cities in anger at an anti-Islam film made in the US.

Fourteen people were killed in the port city of Karachi and a further five died in the north-western city of Peshawar, hospital officials said.

Protesters also breached the diplomatic enclave in the capital, Islamabad, near the US embassy.

There has been widespread unrest over the amateur film, Innocence of Muslims. Dozens of people were reported wounded and some were in a critical condition, reported BBC.

Protests continue in Muslim countries over anti-Islam film and cartoons.

Clashes broke out in Pakistan's five largest cities, defying government calls for peaceful protests on what was declared a national holiday in honour of Prophet Mohammed.

Tens of thousands took to the streets, throwing stones at police who fought back with gunshots and tear gas, at rallies yesterday denouncing the film.

Witnesses estimated that nationwide rallies mobilised more than 45,000, heavily populated by members of rightwing religious parties and supporters of banned terror groups, although the

20 return from Tanzanian jail

Twenty Bangladeshis who had languished in two Tanzanian prisons for the last 11 months finally returned home yesterday morning.

Brokers of unauthorised recruiting agencies lured them to Tanzania promising to get them lucrative jobs but abandoned them at the border of the East African country without travel documents.

The Bureau of Manpower Employment and Training (BMET) brought back the Bangladeshis with the financial assistance of multinational company MGH Group.

"These Bangladeshis were taken to two jails in Tanzania by the immigration police when they tried to cross the border to enter South Africa," said Mohsin Chowdhury, director (welfare) of the BMET.

The repatriated workers alleged that a strong broker network exists in Bangladesh and Tanzania to cheat overseas job aspirants.

"Masum, owner of World Travels took Tk 6 lakh from me on August 18 last year with a promise of a good job in South Africa," Jamal Hassan, one of the victims, told The Daily Star. SEE PAGE 19 COL 4


