## TIN HOUSING IN DHAKA Highly risky yet in high demand

The acrid stench of burnt metal still hangs heavy in the air on the spot where Mohammad Karim's house once stood. It ceased to exist last Thursday, reducing Karim and a thousand others to the role of helpless bystanders as it razed swiftly to the ground, swallowed whole by billowing flames that could well have been hellfire.

Indeed, for Karim and many others, the judgment has been no less harsh.

"I lost everything," says Karim.

Three little words; stark and brutal, but for Karim the consequences of losing everything are just too monumental to comprehend. He keeps repeating those three words almost continually during our brief encounter. It seems he is playing some kind of convoluted psychiatric game of repetition to help him come to terms with the loss of all his worldly possessions.

"I was going to work when I received a call from a friend saying that there was a fire," recalls Karim, who hails from Bogra. The lean young man works for Rajuk, employed as a land measurer in the Purbachal project. "I was in Bishwa Road, when the call came," said Karim. "By the time I reached, there was nothing to do. My home was gone," he says, his eyes lowering to hide the welled up tears.

By any standards, home wasn't much. Nothing more

## Disgraced girl kills herself

She could not take it anymore.

Sonia Akhter, a 17-year-old garment worker, lived with her parents at a tin-shed house in the city's Pallabi.

Three months ago, they rented two rooms at Tk 5,000 per month.

Since the family moved in, the landlady had been keeping the electricity shut every day for about 10 hours from the morning.

The woman also snapped water supply to the tenants and asked them to collect water from a reservoir once a day, citing high electricity and water bills.

According to the contract, the owner was supposed to pay the bills.

## Sonali in a sticky stew

*Recovery effort stalls as mortgaged land of Hall-Mark overvalued; company claims it is now totally off business*

The cash-strapped Sonali Bank is not getting back its money from Hall-Mark Group so soon.

To retrieve the money, the quickest way for the state bank is to sell the Hall-Mark assets mortgaged against the loans.

The controversial business group in a letter on Tuesday informed the state-run bank of its inability to return the money in a short time, Tushar Ahmed,

general manager (commercial) of Hall-Mark, told The Daily Star yesterday.

"We cannot pay back the loans now as our businesses are totally off," he said on the expiry of Sonali Bank's ultimatum to refund in 15 days half of the Tk 2,686 crore loans Hall-Mark had taken on fake documents.

"We want to repay the loans in long-term instalments," he said.

Hall-Mark paid back more than Tk 400 crore to the bank

after the lender stopped disbursing new loans to the company in May this year, said Tushar, who is also a close relative of the company's owner, Tanvir Mahmud.

According to Hall-Mark, its net liabilities to Sonali Bank now stand at Tk 2,268 crore. Of which, Tk 1,567 crore is funded loan meaning that the amount has been given in cash and the remaining amount is

## Car plunge kills 3 kids

At least three children of a family were killed and five others injured after their microbus plunged into a ditch near Chittagong-Kaptai road in Ziabazar area of the port city yesterday morning.

The deceased --Belal Uddin, 10, Asfaq Uddin, 4, nephews of Mohammad Ali Shah and his niece Humaiz Akter, 8, --died on the spot.

Ali, accompanied by his 11 family members and relatives, left for Chittagong Shah Amanat International Airport from Rangunia upazila on the microbus around 5:00am. Injured Ali is an expatriate in Qatar, said his relative Zillur Rahman Habibee.

Tutul Majumder, sub-inspector of Noapara Police Station, said the microbus skidded off the road and fell
