2 missions arrive shortly to assist probe, prepare project implementation schedule

The government yesterday welcomed the World Bank decision to re-engage in the Padma bridge financing along with ADB, Jica and IDB.

Economic Relations Division Secretary Iqbal Mahmud, at a press briefing, conveyed Dhaka's official reaction to the global lender's return to the project.

He added that two missions of WB, Asian Development Bank (ADB) and Japan International Cooperation Agency

(Jica) were due to arrive here shortly.

One will finalise the modalities and schedule of the new arrangement for the project implementation while another will cooperate with the Anti-Corruption Commission probe into the allegations of project graft.

"The decision of the World Bank to come back as one of the co-financiers will bring promising results and a favourable outcome for the citizens of Bangladesh," the ERD secretary said.

Bangladeshi jute researchers are now upbeat at the prospect of commercial release of a new variety of jute -- Snow White Fibre -- following decoding of the genome of deadly fungus macrophomina phaseolina by a team of local scientists.

Globally famed geneticist Dr Maqsudul Alam led the team.

More than a decade ago, Bangladesh Jute Research Institute (BJRI) developed the jute variety with high commercial potentials but withheld its release to farmers considering its too much suscepti-

Election won't be credible under AL admin, Khaleda tells Dinajpur rally

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia yesterday said the next general election must be held under a non-party government and no other formula would work.

"With the people with us, we will create such a situation that the government will have nowhere to escape. No election will be allowed under the present government and incumbent prime minister," she said.

She was addressing a rally at the Gora Shaheed Maidan in Dinajpur. Thousands of leaders, workers and supporters of BNP and its allies attended the rally.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has recently proposed a small cabinet, including opposition representatives, to oversee the next election.

The BNP-led opposition alliance rejected the proposal.
