Bangladesh have to play their best T20 match if they want to turn the tables against mighty Pakistan in their second and final group match and qualify for the Super Eights of the ICC World Twenty20. A win will not be good SRI LANKA 2012 enough for the Tigers; they have to win the

match by a margin that apparently seems beyond their reach but Bangladesh captain Mushfiqur Rahim looked as confident as he could be because he did not want to lose the match without any fight against top favourites Pakistan. The little man was going with the popular saying, while speaking to the media in the pre-match briefing yesterday, that 'nothing is impossible' in the game of cricket.

"We know that only a win will not be enough for us. We have to win the match by 36 runs or greater if we bat first while we have to wait for the finish of the first innings for

the calculations if we bowl first. Apparently we have to achieve the target within 15 to 17 overs if we bat second. We are planning according to the situation because our main motto is to qualify for the second round," said a confident Mushfigur.

"Nothing is impossible in cricket, especially in the T20 format and you know Pakistan is not an unbeatable team. You never know, we can achieve our target if we play our best cricket tomorrow. The equation is very simple; we can gain plenty from the match and there is nothing to lose for

us and it will be a great achievement if we can do something in tomorrow's match," added the wicketkeeper-batsman saying that England were even bowled out for 80 against India the other day.

Mushfiqur however was very much aware of Pakistan's strength but the Tigers have had the experience of playing against them recently in the Asia Cup in March this year and also playing with their key players during the Bangladesh Premier League (BPL).

"We played a very good final against Pakistan in the Asia Cup at home (where Bangladesh lost by 2 runs) and we know their strength as a team. On the other hand we also have a Pakistani spin bowling coach in Saqlain Mushtaq but the bottom line is that our application in the middle must be right if we want to win the match," explained Mushfigur.

"Saeed Ajmal is the main threat and the leading wicket-taker

But Pakistan skipper Mohammad Hafeez is not ready to take anything for granted when they take on Bangladesh in the last Group D match at the Pallekele International Cricket

Stadium today. "We are not thinking as if we have already qualified [for the Super Eights]. We have to play well against Bangladesh, who we know can come hard. On certain days in T20, anybody can win. We are not going to take anyone easy," said Hafeez, affectionately called "the professor", during a pre-match press

conference at Pallekele yesterday.

"All the boys are focused. The most important thing as a unit is that every player wants to do well for Pakistan and is working hard and every man is ready to perform under pressure," he added.

Pakistan's main strength is their bowling, especially the variety in their spin attack, but their batting also clicked against New Zealand in their first game which they won by 13 runs.

"I am really pleased with our bowling options. The best thing for me as a captain is that whenever I ask someone, he is ready to take the pressure," said Hafeez.

"We have different spinners in our side. [Shahid] Afridi is a totally different spinner from Bangladesh's spinners, they rely more on left-arm spin. [Saeed] Ajmal is always difficult for any batsman to pick with his doosra. We rely on them as match-winners. I am happy the way Afridi came up against

New water at World *T20*

World Twenty20 organisers have changed the bottled water supplier and called in food inspectors to check the spread of suspected gastro virus at the tournament, officials said on Monday.

Several players from New Zealand, Ireland, South Africa and Australia have reportedly been treated for stomach bugs since their arrival in Sri Lanka, with Kiwi Tim Southee even requiring hospital treatment for dehydration.

More friendlies for booters

The Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) is set to give the national booters more international exposure hosting Thailand and Nepal national teams at home and travelling to Thailand for an away fixture within the next few months.

Bangladesh played their first international friendly match on September 20 against Nepal and the performance of booters in that match seemed to have encouraged the BFF to host two more international matches in November or December.

"Thailand is eager to host Bangladesh for which we will have to confirm the date. I have asked the chairman of National Teams Committee to fix a date and inform me as I am leaving for Zurich tonight to attend FIFA's marketing Committee meeting," said BFF president Kazi Salahuddin yesterday.

Salahuddin is supposed to meet with the Thailand Football Federation president in Zurich where he will confirm the date for the away fixture. Thailand is also eager to play a match in Bangladesh, Salahuddin told.

The BFF boss also informed that they were trying to hold a friendly match against Nepal before the start of the professional football league which is scheduled to get underway in November.

Apart from the national team commitments, the BFF will also send Bangladesh U-23 team to Sri Lanka in November for a tournament where all member nations of SAARC are being invited by the Sri Lanka Sports Ministry.
