Worried to death, 2 workers leave for KL a week after schedule; 1,000 hajj pilgrims also stuck

Ekhlasur Rahman and Nasir Hossain, two young migrant workers, yesterday left Dhaka with job worries as their departure was delayed by a week due to the flight disorder of Biman Bangladesh Airlines.

They had first come to Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport on September 17 to catch a flight to Malaysia.

While the duo waited at the airport yesterday, about 1,000 hajj pilgrims were stranded in the city as three flights of National Air Services were delayed. Ekhlasur, 27, and Nasir, 28, came to Bangladesh on a

month's vacation after spending four years in Malacca City in Malaysia. They work in the same section of a textile company and share a room in that country.

The duo had told Biman officials that they must catch a flight that day so that they did not face any trouble at their workplace.

"But the officials were not convinced. They first rescheduled our flight to September 18 and then again to September 25 the following day," Ekhlasur told The Daily Star at the airport.

BLOCKING YOUTUBE Many Google services disrupted in Bangladesh

The government's blocking of video streaming website YouTube is disrupting many popular Google services in Bangladesh.

Most Internet users in Bangladesh are unable to access Google services like Google+ (Google's social network), Google Maps, Google Drive (cloud storage of Google), Google News, Google sync and Google Play (application

store of Google). There have been reports that even Gmail, the free email service of Google, has also been disrupted.

Most Razakar, Al-Badr men were from Jamaat

Muntassir Mamoon tells war crimes tribunal

Most members of the Shanti Committee, the Razakars, Al-Badr and Al-Shams were from the Jamaat-e-Islami, said eminent historian Prof Muntassir Mamoon at International Crimes Tribunal-1 yesterday.

Prosecution witness Muntassir said this during cross-examination in the war crimes case against former Jamaat chief Ghulam Azam, when a defence counsel suggested that the Razakar and

Al-Badr were not separate forces.

"It's new information because, according to my knowledge, though Razakar, Shanti Committee, Al-Badr and Al-Shams were counted separately, the lion's share of the members of these forces were Jamaat men," said Muntassir.

Defence counsel Mizanul Islam suggested that Muntassir had no idea about the total number of members of the Shanti Committee, Razakar, Al-Badr and Al-Shams men and therefore his


The pall of gloom over the hill district of Rangamati has begun to fade away following a peace procession of hundreds of Bangalee settlers and indigenous people yesterday.


