

Jose plans to emulate Fergie

Real Madrid's Jose Mourinho has given a heavy hint that he is planning to emulate Alex Ferguson at Manchester United by continuing to coach until he is in his 70s.

Mourinho turns 50 in January and says he adores football so much that he can envisage spending another 20 years in the sport.

"I understand perfectly why Alex is still in the job (at the age of 70) and I think I will be the same," the outspoken Portuguese told Britain's Sky Sports Television in an interview.

"I love football so much, I love coaching so much. I will still be very young when I become 50 and I believe I have a lot in front of me."

Mourinho, who with Real Madrid is bidding to become the first coach to win the Champions League with three different clubs following his triumphs with Porto in 2004 and Inter Milan in 2010, said he had a lot more still to achieve as a coach.

"Fifty is a number with a certain impact - it's a number I believe sometimes has a psychologically negative impact on many people because they realise the world spins very, very fast and our lives are very, very short," he said, laughing.

"It's a number that makes me think and look back but also look forward too. I'm such a happy person because what I have done so far I think is amazing."

"I look back and reflect on this and have to be thankful for what God gave me," added Mourinho, the only coach to win the top three leagues in European football with Real, Inter and Chelsea.

Croatian side get female touch

A former Croatia Miss Sport finalist and footballer Tihana Nemcic became the first woman to be appointed coach of a men's club on Tuesday, local media reported.

The 24-year-old Nemcic will coach Croatian fifth division side NK Viktorija Vojakovac.

"I am the head coach and I have full liberty to create and plan the team's tactics," she told daily 24 sata (24 hours).

"The guys know the game, but there is a lot more to do," added Nemcic, who has played for Dinamo Zagreb's women's team and the national squad.

Nemcic said that there was no reason why eyebrows should be raised in her getting the job.

"If a woman and a man have the same professional qualifications for a coaching job, I see no reason why I should not get into male football," she said.

City sent packing

Premier League champions Manchester City and in-form Everton were both sent packing from the League Cup on Tuesday, their respective managers paying the price for making wholesale changes to their starting lineups for the third round ties.

City lost 4-2 after extra-time to top flight rivals Aston Villa with a completely different team to the one that started the 1-1 draw against Arsenal on Sunday, while Everton made six changes and were beaten 2-1 by second-tier Leeds United.

Chelsea also rung the changes but, captained by John Terry despite this week's FA hearing over charges of racial abuse, they emphatically booked their place in the fourth round with a 6-0 win over Wolverhampton Wanderers at Stamford Bridge.

City's second-string team still included multi-million pound signings Carlos Tevez, Jack Rodwell, James Milner, Gareth Barry and Mario Balotelli.

The latter drilled home a low shot to give City the lead with his first club goal since March, before Villa levelled when their former midfielder Barry deflected the ball into his own net.

Aleksandar Kolarov whipped in a free kick to give City the advantage for the second time on 64 minutes but Gabriel Agbonlahor

levelled five minutes later to force extra time.

Charles N'Zogbia pounced on a loose ball to make it 3-2 and Agbonlahor wrapped up the tie with the aid of a big deflection that caused his shot to loop over City keeper Costel Pantilimon.

Everton manager David Moyes retained only Victor Anichebe, Seamus Coleman, Marouane Fellaini, Johnny Heitinga and Kevin Mirallas from the team that started the 3-0 win over Swansea City on Saturday.

The visitors had made a barnstorming start to the Premier League campaign, sitting third after five matches, but their new-look 11 were quickly under pressure at Elland Road.

They fell behind when Aidy White jinked his way through the heart of the visitors' defence and curled a shot into the top corner after four minutes.

Leeds doubled their lead when a Danny Pugh shot was prodded into the bottom corner by Rodolph Austin in the second half before Sylvain Distin headed in a late consolation.

Chelsea's Terry returned to their lineup, having started on the bench for Saturday's Premier League clash against Stoke City, seemingly able to put allegations that he racially abused Queens Park Rangers defender Anton Ferdinand out of his mind.

But it was his central defensive partner, Gary Cahill, who headed in a Juan Mata free kick after four minutes before Ryan Bertrand stroked home from 10 metres and Mata effectively ended the contest by scoring their third after only 17 minutes.

Juve drop first points

Italian champions Juventus extended their unbeaten Serie A run to 44 games on Tuesday but dropped points for the first time this season as they drew 0-0 away at Fiorentina.

'The Old Lady of Turin' - who went through the whole of last season unbeaten - could be joined on 13 points should closest challengers Napoli beat third-placed Lazio on Wednesday.

Vincenzo Montella, the former Italian international striker and now coach of Fiorentina, said that he was frustrated at not taking all three points but was happy because it showed the team was making progress.

Fiorentina, who have still not beaten Juve at home since 1998, had their chances to take the points especially in the first-half first through star player Stevan Jovetic, the Montenegrin heading against the bar four minutes from the break.

His Serbian team-mate Adem Ljajic

should have done better a minutes later having escaped the Juve defence only to be outsmarted by Buffon.

The hosts also had the better of the second-half, with the Juve front two failing to fire and Andrea Pirlo as little out of sorts with his usually pinpoint passing.

Fiorentina's Argentinian defender Sebastian Roncaglia put a shot just wide in the 53rd minute and a good effort by skipper Manuel Pasqual nine minutes from time went along the goalline without crossing it.

Bayern cruise past Wolves

Mario Mandzukic scored twice as Bayern Munich hardly faced a challenge in easing past VfL Wolfsburg 3-0 on Tuesday to remain their perfect start to the Bundesliga campaign.

But Eintracht Frankfurt dropped their first points of the season - though they did draw 3-3 against reigning champions Borussia Dortmund.

Bastian Schweinsteiger hit the post twice before giving Bayern the lead in the 24th minute. With Wolfsburg rarely venturing forward, Mandzukic doubled the advantage with a header in the 57th minute.

The Croatian international finished off Wolfsburg for good with his fifth Bundesliga goal of the season in the 65th minute.

Bayern's Peruvian veteran striker Claudio Pizarro meanwhile came on as a substitute late on to make a 337th appearance in the German league - a joint record for a foreign player which he now shares with Brazil's former Bayern star Ze Roberto.

Bayern have a perfect 15 points from five matches and are two points ahead of Frankfurt and seven on Dortmund.

Dortmund went 2-0 up with goals by Lukas Piszczek in the 25th minute and Marco Reus in the 28th.

Vidic out for 2 months

Manchester United defender Nemanja Vidic will miss the next eight weeks after undergoing surgery on a knee injury, the Premier League club announced on Tuesday.

Vidic was rested for the 2-1 weekend win at Liverpool after complaining of tightness in his right knee but further tests revealed the true extent of the problem, and the Serb has since had a meniscus operation.

"Nemanja Vidic has had a meniscus operation on his right knee and will be out for around eight weeks," a club statement read.

"The central defender was operated on this week and will be sidelined for about eight weeks."
