Bail plea of 7 Panchagarh Jamaat men rejected

A Panchagarh court yesterday rejected the bail prayers of seven Jamaat activists accused in a case filed on charge of beating up BCL and Jubo League men on Tuesday in Panchagarh town.

Police arrested Anwar Hossain, 30, Amirul Islam, 24, Rafiqul Islam, 25, Ali Hossain, 40, Abdul Malek, 27, Hasibul Islam, 30, and Rubul Amin, 22, on Tuesday night.

The arrestees are among the 100 accused in the case filed by Jubo League activist Md. Masum with Panchagarh police station under Special Trail Act. Thirty-nine of the accused are identified by the complainant.

Chief judicial magistrate Abu Monsur Md. Ziaul Haque turned down the plea after the defence lawyers placed the bail prayers before the court.

The accused in the case include district nayeb-ameer and also Sadar upazila chairman Abdul Khalek.

Police and witnesses said, on Tuesday at about 5:00pm, the Jamaat men brought out a procession in Panchagarh town protesting the arrest of Jamaat leader Maolana Abdus Subhan. After the procession, they were holding a rally in front of LG Show Room.

At that time, district unit general secretary of BCL Mizanur Rahman and Jubo League activist Md. Masum were going by the area. All of a sudden, the Jamaat and Shibir men swooped on them and gave them a good beating.

Hearing the news, the agitated BCL and Jubo League men rushed to the place and at one stage attacked Jamaat leader Abdul Khalek's house and business establishment.

The BCL-Jubo League activists also staged a road-block, demanding arrest of the local Jamaat ameer.

JHENIDAH, PABNA

3 killed as rivals clash over land dispute

Three people were killed and nine others injured in clashes over land dispute in Jhenidah and Pabna yesterday and the day before.

Two of the three were killed in Kaliganj upazila of Jhenidah yesterday, reports our correspondent.

Police identified the dead as Moinul Haq Biswas, 35, son of Musa Biswas and Nazrul Islam, 55, son of Hatem Ali, of Ramnagar village in the upazila.

Iqbal Bahar Chowdhury, officer in-charge of Jhenidah Sadar police station, said there had been a longstanding dispute between Jinnat Ali and Hatem Ali over a piece of land.

The clash ensued around 9:30am yesterday when people of Jinnat Ali went to occupy the land and were resisted by the supporters of Hatem Ali, the OC said.

Both the groups were equipped with sharp weapons and iron rods during the clash.

Moinul was stabbed during the clash and died on the spot while Nazrul succumbed to his injuries at Jessore Medical College and Hospital.

Four other injured in the clash were admitted to Kaliganj upazila health complex.

In Pabna, a man was killed and five others were injured as the two rival groups clashed over piece of

disputed land at Durgapur village of Sujanagar upazila on Wednesday, reports our correspondent.

The deceased was identified as Md Abdul Jobbar, 60, of the village.

Jobbar was planting trees on the disputed land on Wednesday afternoon.

Protesting it, supporters of Akbor Hossain of the village attacked him triggering a clash.

Critically injured Jobbar was taken to Pabna Medical College Hospital where he died at night.

Officer in-charge of Sujanagar police station said that a case was filed and six people were held in connection with the incident.

A tale of cruelty unbounded

Torture of the harshest kind on a six-year-old girl has surpassed medieval cruelty at Radakantapur village in Sonatola upazila.

Zinia Akter is now being treated at Shaheed Ziaur Rahman Medical College Hospital with the left leg that was cut off allegedly by her neighbour on Tuesday.

Police said Zinia, daughter of Zihadul Islam of the village, picked a quarrel with one Jim Khatun, 7, daughter of Jamsed Ali over a trivial matter a few days ago.

Later, the families of the duo locked in an altercation over the issue.

As a sequel to the feud, Jamsed took the girl out

of her house on Tuesday night and cut off her leg from the ankle joint at a nearby place when the family members were asleep.

Hearing the hue and cry, they rushed to the spot, rescued Zinia and sent her to the hospital,

said Zihadul.

Police on Wednesday arrested Jamsed in connection with the incident, said Khalequzzaman, officer in-charge at Sonatola police station.

"An attempted murder case was filed against the arrestee", said the OC.

BNP leader shot dead in Meherpur

A local BNP leader was shot dead by criminals in Gangni upazila of Meherpur yesterday morning.

The victim was identified as Abdul Alim, 45, BNP president of Bamundi village unit and BNP secretary of Bamundi Bazar Committee.

Bimol Krishna Mallik, officer in-charge of Gangni police station, said a gang of around six intercepted Alim when he along with his brother Intaz Ali was going to Bamundi Bazar on a motorbike around 10:30am.

"The criminals shot Alim from point blank range. Three bullets pierced his head killing him on the spot," the OC said, quoting witnesses.

The killers then left the scene firing two shots in the air, he said.

On information, police from Bamundi camp rushed to the spot and recovered Alim's body.

According to police, Alim was accused in a case filed for killing local Awami League activist Meherul Islam on August 18.

Sources, however, said Alim was not in the country on the day of murder as he went to Saudi Arabia on August 16 to perform *umrah*.

Meherpur Judicial Magistrate Court sent Alim to jail after he was arrested on September 18. He was released on bail on September 23.

Contacted, Abdullah Hel Baki, superintendent of police in Meherpur, said police are investigating the murderer of Alim.

"We will file a case after a discussion with Alim's family members," the SP told.

JOURNALIST JAMAL MURDER

Plea to shift case from police to Rab rejected

A court here yesterday rejected the plea to shift journalist Jamal Uddin murder case from police to Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) for investigation.

On September 10, Jamal's father Abdul Alim submitted the prayer to the Court of Senior Judicial Magistrate Maruf Hossain, mentioning that a Rab investigation found involvement of a couple of policemen in Jamal murder and so, the investigation could be hampered if police conducts it.

Meanwhile the case was shifted to the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) on September 11.

Mahbubur Rahman Bachchu, lawyer of plaintiff Abdul Alim, said now he (Alim) can go to the higher court with his prayer.

"I will go to the High Court as police is conducting the investigation although involvement of a

couple of policemen in the murder has been found," Abdul Alim said.

Jamal Uddin, 35, Kashipur correspondent of Jessore-based daily Gramer Kagoj, was brutally killed after abduction from a tea stall at Kashipur Bazar in Sharsha upazila under

Jessore district on the night of June 15 this year.

The criminals, who stabbed Jamal Uddin to death, also gouged out his left eye and cut the tendons of legs.

The next day, Jamal's father Abdul Alim filed a case with Sharsha police station in this connection accusing seven people -- Tota Mallick, Raju Mallick and Ukil Mallick, sons of Shamsheer Mallick, Ramjan Member, son of late Akbar Ali Sheikh, and Lata Begum, wife of Tota Mia, of Kashipur village, Bazlur Rahman, son of late Amzad Haq Mollah, and Jasim Uddin of Tengrali village.

Police arrested Lata Begum on the night of killing, Ukil Mallick, arrested from Helencha Market under Bagda Thana in 24 Pargana of Pashchimbanga in India on June 24, is still in Indian jail, and Rab arrested Raju Mallick from Arpara of Magura district on July 6.

Youth stabbed to death for protesting stalking

A young man was stabbed to death by a gang allegedly for protesting stalking by them at Abad Kachua village in Sadar upazila on Wednesday night.

The victim was identified as Manzurul Alam Prince, 30, son of former UP chairman Mahmud Hossain of Kachua union.

Police yesterday morning arrested three suspects -- Kamrul Islam and Harun-ur-Rashid, sons of Laltu Hossain and Farid Hossain, son of Badruzzaman of Khalkanda area at Abad Kachua village.

Locals and police said, Prince was returning home by a motorbike from Jessore town


on Wednesday night. A local gang halted him at Rainatola point of the village, stabbed him indiscriminately and left the place immediately along with his motorbike.

Locals took him to Jessore Medical College Hospital where the duty doctor declared him dead.

Officer in-charge of Kotwali police station Golam Rahman said that the murder was a sequel to previous enmity.

Three days ago, Prince had beaten up the arrestees for stalking some girls of Kachua High School, said the OC, adding that police were looking for a few more youths involved in the killing.

Prince's father former UP chairman Mahmud Hossain yesterday filed a case, he said.
