## 22 Destiny officials' bail cancelled

A Dhaka court yesterday cancelled bail to 22 high officials of Destiny Group including its Managing Director Md Rafiqul Amin in two money laundering cases.

The court also ordered the accused to surrender before the lower court.

Following the cancellation of the bail, the accused must have to go to jail upon surrender, Kabir Hussain, public prosecutor of the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC), told The Daily Star.

Judge Mohammad Zahirul Haque of the Senior Special Judge's Court passed the order after the ACC had filed four criminal appeals challenging the legality of the bail granted to the Destiny officials by three lower courts.

## HAJJ FLIGHTS OF NAS Further delays worry pilgrims

Sufferings of hajj pilgrims continue, as more flights of National Air Services (NAS) were delayed for longer periods contrary to the claims made by the airline authorities. Passengers complained that they had been staying in

hotels and the hajj camp at Ashkona for the last two days as their Jeddah flight did not leave on September 25 as scheduled. Mohammad Mizan and his wife arrived at the airport

on Tuesday to catch their NAS Air flight to Jeddah, but had to stay for a day at the hajj camp and another day at a boarding house. "Nobody informed us that the flight has been

delayed," he told The Daily Star.

Pilgrims flocking at the airport from across the country shared similar tales of their plight caused by the twoday delay.

Leader of a group of 84 hajj pilgrims, Zakir Hossain claimed neither the airline nor the travel agents informed him about the delay. "I was informed by other sources,"

## 300 killed in a single day

Up to 700,000 could flee by year-end: UNHCR

More than 300 people were killed in Syria on Wednesday, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said, in one of the bloodiest days in the 18-month uprising against President Bashar al-Assad.

The British-based organisation, which monitors violence in Syria through a network of activists, said in a report released

yesterday that 55 people were killed in rural areas around Damascus.

They included at least 40 who appeared to have been shot in cold blood in the town of al-Dhiyabia, southeast of the capital.

Also yesterday, the UN refugee agency said the number of refugees fleeing Syria could reach 700,000 by the end of the year,


