

Extremists 'linked'

Islam-insulting Facebook photo led to outburst, unidentified person tagged Buddhist man in the pic, locals say some Rohingya, militant groups incited mayhem since Saturday midnight

In what turned out to be long hours of arson and vandalism, a mob destroyed 12 Buddhist temples and monasteries and more than 50 houses in Ramu upazila of Cox's Bazar early yesterday. The violence was apparently triggered by a

Facebook posting of a photo defaming the holy Quran. Some miscreants also vandalised

two monasteries and a Hindu temple in Chittagong's Patiya upazila and torched two monasteries at Ukhia and five houses at Teknaf upazila in Cox's Bazar.

Selim Md Jahangir, Cox's Bazar

superintendent of police, said three Buddhist temples were burnt to ashes during the frenzy that started around midnight Saturday and continued till 3:00am yesterday.

The temples include some century-old pagodas, most revered by

Afsar rejects results, saying polls 'stage-managed'

Ruling Awami League candidate Simeen Hussain Rimi yesterday won the Gazipur-4 bypolls by a huge margin amid a very low voter turnout and peaceful polls atmosphere.

Rimi tallied 63,401 votes, overshadowing her two rivals -- Afsaruddin, her uncle and independent candidate, and Communist Party of Bangladesh-backed Asadullah Badal who received 26,349 and 1,428 votes respectively.

PADMA FINANCING WB postpones team's visit

The World Bank has postponed sending a team to Dhaka to formulate a framework of new arrangements to implement the Padma bridge project.

The team was scheduled to arrive here today. In a statement on Wednesday, the WB for the second time reminded the government that it would finance the project if the implementation of all the measures it asked for is satisfactory.

The statement came five days after the global lender announced its reengagement in the project and just one day after Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina made some remarks in New York on WB's return to the project.


