Mamata may bring no trust vote against govt

Attacking the government on FDI in retail and price rise, Trinamool Congress chief Mamata Banerjee yesterday indicated that her party may bring a 'no-confidence motion' against it in the next Parliament session and appealed to various political parties to support it.

At a protest rally at Jantar Mantar in New Delhi, which was attended by National Democratic Alliance (NDA) convenor Sharad Yadav, Mamata said that she had "heard" that the general elections could be advanced and held in March next year.

"We also don't want this government. If need be, we are ready for bringing a no-

ment," the West Bengal Chief Minister said while launching an all-out attack on the Congressled United Progressive Alliance (UPA) government. Trinamool Congress, which has withdrawn support to the government, has 19 MPs in Lok Sabha.

Mamata, whose party organised the protest against FDI in retail, diesel price hike and LPG cap, said she could also bring a resolution against these decisions.

"I have heard that elections will happen in March. I am ready for a resolution," she said.

She also appealed to other political parties not to support the government and asked them to support her party's resolution against the recent decisions on FDI and




