## Ibra rules out Messi

Hammers nail QPR

West Ham United climbed to seventh place in the Premier League with a 2-1 win at bottom club Queens Park Rangers on Monday, the London club's first away win of the season.

First-half goals from record signing Matt Jarvis, bought from Wolverhampton Wanderers for 10.75 million pounds (\$17.36 million), and Ricardo Vaz Te sealed West Ham's victory over their London rivals.

Jarvis's first goal for the Londoners, a neatly-taken header past the despairing dive of former Inter Milan and Champions League-winning goalkeeper Julio Cesar, stunned the home side who are still winless and with just two points from six games.

Vaz Te made it 2-0 with a crafty volley at the far post after a corner was scrambled away by QPR who rallied in the second half courtesy of an unstoppable looping shot by Adel Taarabt on 57 minutes.

Their charge was halted by the sending-off of substitute Samba Diakite 15 minutes from time following two swift yellow cards and West Ham moved to 11 points, five behind leaders Chelsea and level with Tottenham Hotspur and West Bromwich Albion.

Two-time Champions Leaguewinning coaches Jose Mourinho and Carlo Ancelotti will be looking to guide

Real Madrid and Paris Saint Germain respectively to a second successive victory in the group stages on Wednesday.

Both Mourinho and then Ancelotti failed to deliver European club football's premier trophy with Chelsea galling for both that the relative novice Roberto di Matteo succeeded where they failed last season.

The pressure is very much on both men this time round as Mourinho, who has won with Porto and Inter Milan, has yet to deliver the trophy to Real - they have gone out in the semifinals in the past two seasons.

Ancelotti, twice a winner with AC Milan, might be in his first Champions League campaign with the French side but their Qatari backers will be expecting a long run in the competition after laying out millions of euros on players.

Both have tricky away trips Real to Dutch giants Ajax and PSG to Porto.

While Real grabbed a late but deserved 3-2 victory at home to Manchester City in the first game, Ajax fell to a late goal away at Borussia Dortmund.

Since the victory over City Real have looked a different side to the one that had fallen eight points behind bitter rivals Barcelona in La Liga, and while the gap remains the same the 'meringues' have won both their subsequent league games, thrashing Deportivo La Coruna 5-1 on Sunday.

Mourinho will have to juggle his line-up as it is a crucial week with a

## Ballack hangs up his boots

Ex-Germany captain Michael Ballack has retired from professional football, his manager Michael Becker confirmed on Tuesday, with the former Chelsea star currently without a club.

Having turned 36 at the end of last month, Ballack has been without a team after his two-year deal at Bayer Leverkusen expired in June.

Since leaving Leverkusen, Ballack had been reported to be negotiating with clubs in north America's MSL and Australia's A-League, but has decided to hang up his boots.

Ballack made the last of his 98 appearances for Germany when he captained the team during their friendly defeat against Argentina in March 2010 having made his national debut back in April 1999 against Scotland.

An ankle injury he suffered playing for Chelsea in the FA Cup final in May 2010 ruled Ballack out of the last World Cup in South Africa when he lost the captaincy of the national team to Bayern Munich's Philipp Lahm.

## Criscito to wear mask

Zenit St Petersburg left back Domenico Criscito will wear a plastic mask to protect a broken cheekbone if he plays in Wednesday's Champions League Group C clash with AC Milan.

"I'll be ready to play tomorrow but head coach (Luciano Spalletti) will make a final decision," the Italy international told the club's website on Tuesday.

Criscito, who missed Zenit's 3-0 defeat at Malaga in their Champions League opener last month with a thigh injury, broke his left cheekbone in Saturday's 1-1 draw against Lokomotiv Moscow.

The 25-year-old, who joined Zenit from Genoa a year ago, said he knew Milan well from Italy's Serie A.

"I've played against them many times in the past, tasting both defeat and victories. Now, they have a young team that wants to prove itself," he said.

Zenit said Belgium midfielder Axel Witsel, who joined them for 40 million euros (\$52.59 million) from Benfica just before last month's transfer deadline, was available for selection after recovering from a pulled hamstring.

However, the Russians champions are still missing injured midfielder Sergei Semak and Portugal international Danny as well as Russia skipper Igor Denisov, who has refused to play for the club and demanded to renegotiate his contract.
